The first ten minutes of a Parish Council meeting are open to the public to raise possible items for future meetings; or to comment on items on the agenda for that meeting.

The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 25 July 2018 are available on the website and on the noticeboard in Coronation Gardens www.ldevillage.org. A meeting of the Ide Parish Council Planning Committee was held on Monday 13 August 2018 at 7pm. Full minutes of this meeting are also available on the website and noticeboard.

The next meeting of the **Planning Committee** is on Wednesday 19 September 2018 at 6pm at The Hub unless otherwise advised. To view planning applications, go to www.teignbridge.gov.uk/planning and search using the address or reference number.

Meetings of the Planning Committee are held in public and you are welcome to attend. There is time allocated at the start of the meetings for public participation. **Ide Neighbourhood Plan.** The result of the referendum held on 26 July 2018 was a clear vote for adopting the Neighbourhood Plan: 114 Yes, 15 No. This now goes forward to Teignbridge District Council's Executive Meeting on 4 September 2018 for adoption. The plan will then be "made". The Parish Council extended their warm thanks to the steering group and their delight with the Independent Examiner's report at their meeting on 25 July 2018. The plan appears on the village website.

Weir Meadow and Pynes Orchard. The two working groups are in detailed talks with the Church Commissioners, and their agents Strutt and Parker. The purchase price for each field has been agreed. For Weir Meadow, the issue of agricultural access to the fields to the north, adjacent to College Lane, is still under discussion. For Pynes Orchard, we are discussing terms for an annual licence to rent the land whilst funds are raised.

Multi Use Games Area at Ide School: A booking form is now available on the website www.ldevillage.org.uk, key holders have been appointed, and terms and conditions of use have been drawn up. The school has agreed that village residents may book the MUGA free of charge for personal or family use. There will be a charge for groups or clubs. We are very grateful to Ann Boyce, chairman of the school governors, for her assistance in reaching this point.

IDE MEMORIAL HALL

It is hard to believe that 12 months ago we had not even started work on the Memorial Hall refurbishment. The roofing contractors came in during the last week in August 2017 with the annex work starting in early September.

It gave the development team much pleasure to see the Hall in full use during last Saturday's very successful pop-up café and to hear appreciative comments about the 'new' Hall. We were pleased to have the curtains fitted for this event and fortunately everyone seems to think that the material was a good choice.



The curtains are fitted with blackout linings so most external light can now be excluded from the Hall if appropriate for a particular use. A huge thank you to Janet and David Williams, Lynne, Jane, Karen and Janice for choosing the material and then organising a couple of 'sweatshops' in the Hall to make it up into curtains. Definitely a first-class job.

The installation of a new oak engineered floor is due to start on 4th September. This will be the end of a huge amount of refurbishment work that has taken place over the past year. We have still not finished, however, and we are working hard on a further funding application to enable us to buy new tables and chairs, a demountable stage and paint the outside of the building and complete a few other bits and pieces.

We are concerned about the level of resonance in the building which can make it difficult to have conversations when the building is fairly full. The new curtains have helped to some degree and if we are able to buy new upholstered chairs then this will also help. We have started to research the use of acoustic panels to bring the resonance down to a comfortable level. Building acoustics is a very tricky science!

Ide's Roman Signal Station

Thanks to the glorious summer we're having there's been a lot in the press and on-line regarding the appearance of rarely seen archaeological crop marks in fields and gardens across the UK. Crop marks, which are notoriously difficult to see at ground level, appear in grass or crops, thanks to subtle changes in the underlying earth, usually the result of historic disturbance of the ground. They're great therefore, if the conditions are right, for showing up shadows of past buildings, ditches and earthworks.

With this in mind, Simon Rice and I took a trip up to the site of the Roman signal station on the boundary of the village, hoping that the long spell of dry weather would mean that we could see markings in the field relating to the station. Thanks to Simon's drone and his flying skills, we were amazed to see the crop marks so clearly: as the picture here shows, you can clearly see the inner site of the signal tower as well as the outer ditch. The site has been excavated archaeologically and is believed to date from the first century AD. Unfortunately, a later road cuts through the site.

To put the site in context, the signal station at Ide was one of two known stations that served the Roman city of Exeter (Isca Dumnoniorum); the other being at Stoke Hill. Roman signal stations were rectangular towers of stone or wood situated within ditched, embanked, palisaded or walled enclosures. The station at Ide measured approximately 32 by 34m. They were built by the Roman army for military observation and signalling by means of fire or smoke. They normally formed an element of a wider system of defence and signalling between military sites such as forts and camps and towns, generally as part of a chain of stations to cover long distances. In northern England stations were used in particular to augment the main frontier formed by Hadrian's Wall, but elsewhere stations were constructed along the coast to keep lookout over the sea and to signal information both along the coast and to inland sites.



As one of a small group of Roman military monuments, which are important in representing army strategy, government policy and the pattern of military control, signal stations are of importance to our understanding of the period. All Roman signal stations with surviving archaeological remains are considered to be



nationally important. Please note that the site is a designated protected monument, is on privately owned land and is not accessible by the public. Colin Chapman

SAFE ROUTES FOR IDE

It has been most heartening that the police have been supportive of villager's efforts to make Ball's Farm Road the safe route it should be for those using sustainable methods of transport to and from Exeter. They recently paid another visit, with a total of 10 or so police personnel handing our fines to those entering Doctor's Walk from the C50 during the proscribed 7am until 9.30am period, and checking that those accessing Ball's Farm Road and Little John's Cross Hill from other directions were legally entitled to do so. Once the police have carried out however many visits they plan to make, our understanding is that they will then compose a report to the powers that be, giving recommendations as to how a long-term solution to the current 'danger to life and limb' suffered by pedestrians, cyclists, horseyhorse types and other legitimate users of Ball's Farm Road can be arrived at.

Of course, Ball's Farm Road is not the only route into Exeter; there's also Little John's Cross Hill . . . puff pant, puff pant, not ideal.

A third route, for cyclists, is along the C50 to the big A30 Alphington interchange roundabout, then onto the short piece of cyclepath that leads into the Alphington end of Ide Lane, from which, via Clapperbrook Lane it's easy by bike to access the excellent cycle routes that run up and down alongside the river and canal and beyond. Unfortunately the C50 is very busy (there is a pavement, but it's rough, intended only for pedestrians, and only 18 inches wide in places due to

undergrowth) and the roundabout very dangerous, especially as the access for cyclists and pedestrians into Ide Lane Alphington is on the inside of a blind bend, on the A30 slip road, just as vehicles are accelerating up to the A30 ! What brilliant road planning!

As many of you will know, a new and grandiose garden centre on the site of the previous and modest 'Springwell Nursery' is currently under discussion as a planning proposal, for which Teignbridge District Council may or may not give planning permission. The Highways Authority, as a statutory consultee, have stated that, in the interests of sustainability, "the walking and cycle route to this development would need to be upgraded between the roundabout at the A30 junction to the entrance of Springwell. The footway would need to be widened to 3m to ensure a safe and suitable access for all users." Interesting, very interesting, regardless of whether you are for or against the planning proposal.

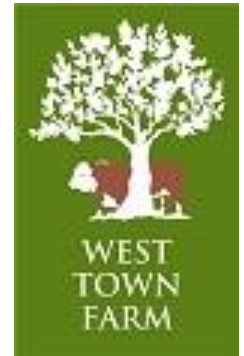
