

Ide Neighbourhood Plan was formally “made” when Teignbridge District Council adopted it on 4 September 2018. Hard copies are available in the shop. At the Parish Council meeting on 19 Sept the chairman thanked Chris Bishop and the steering group for their work and success in this significant achievement.

Pynes Community Orchard Working Group: The Council has agreed arrangements for Andrew Bragg to enter into an annual renewable licence with the Church Commissioners to occupy the Orchard on behalf of the Parish Council and its Orchard Working Group, as from 29 September 2018. This will allow the Working Group, under Andrew’s guidance, to get onto the Orchard and begin work to restore it. It will also provide a reasonable period of time for the Group to raise the necessary funds for the Parish Council to buy the orchard. The intention is then for the community, based on the current Working Group, to take on the Orchard under a suitable form (charitable or otherwise) of co-operative benefit society or enterprise to run it in the long term.

Weir Meadow Working Group: The principle of the Parish Council purchasing the Meadow from the Church Commissioners for use as a recreation and sports field, and the price, have both been agreed. Negotiations about rights of access for farm machinery across the Meadow to the fields to the north are the remaining obstacle, and are “ongoing”. The chairman of the Working Group, Richard Cloke, has been working on proposals for an alternative suitable access route, and we hope this will be resolved soon. Over the summer a number of events have raised substantial sums of money for the Weir Meadow project: as at 19 Sept the current total deposited in the Parish Council’s separate Weir Meadow account stood at £2,050.

Communities Together Fund. Teignbridge DC runs a fund for community projects, and, based on our population, there is around £490 available for the residents of Ide. Mel Liversage has the necessary (simple) application form. If you have a village project in mind that might get off the ground with this level of support, then please get in touch with Mel.

When the current building works have finished, we will plant two replacement rowan trees on the grass bank along **The Hams**.

On behalf of the village, we extend a big thank you to Jackie Chadwick for her work over this long dry summer keeping the planters at the village entrance watered – using buckets from the stream!

The next **Parish Council** meeting will be held in Ide Memorial Hall on Wednesday 21 November 2018 at 7.30pm.

If you have an issue you would like the council to discuss, please contact the chairman or another parish councillor. Requests for items to be considered for inclusion on the agenda should be made at least 14 days before the date of the meeting. The first ten minutes of a Parish Council meeting are open to the public to raise possible items for future meetings; or to comment on items on the agenda for that meeting.


Meetings of the Planning Committee are held in public and you are welcome to attend. There is time allocated at the start of the meetings for public participation.



We are busy improving our prayer lives and becoming warriors in the spiritual world. Our 6 week study is based on the movie 'War Room'. It's a brilliant movie!



