The Parish Council co-opted a new councillor, Mark Thomas, at the meeting held on 14 March 2018. We welcome him to the Parish Council and look forward to working with him.

Neighbourhood Plan. The submission version of the Neighbourhood Plan has met the current and legal and procedural requirements to go to the Public Consultation Stage which runs from 26 February to 13 April 2018. An independent examiner will be appointed during this time. This version is displayed on the Ide Village website and hard copies are available in the Community Shop, the Huntsman Inn, The Poachers, St Ida's Church and Ide Congregational Church. **Pynes Community Orchard Working Group -** the minutes of the meeting held on 14 March 2018 are available on the website.

Weir Meadow Working Group - the minutes of the meeting held on 27 February 2018 are available on the website.

The Ide Walks Leaflet has been reworked and the council has agreed to fund the printing costs. These will be available, free of charge in the Community Shop and pubs, shortly.

We rely on your support throughout the year so that our shop will be here for all of us when we need it. Our thanks to a hardy band of volunteers who ventured out in the snow to buy milk and bread so that we didn't run out completely. It was interesting that even a couple of days after our milk and bread had come through and we were fully stocked, the local supermarkets still had empty shelves. We are proud to support local businesses, our milk, bread, eggs and most of our vegetables and cheeses come from the West Country and mostly from very close to home

IDE MEMORIAL HALL

This maybe the last time you see the stage in the Memorial Hall because work starts on 20th March on the next phase of the Hall refurbishment. The target is to bring the main hall up to the standard of the recently completed kitchen and toilets.



The phase about to start will include:

- Removing the stage and the big task of making good the floor walls and ceiling
- Replacing the central heating boiler and bringing the system up to scratch
- Replacing the old fibreboard ceiling with plasterboard adding insulation and renewing the electrics including new lighting.
- Building an entrance vestibule with new front door and inner door to keep out the draughts.
- We would ideally like to continue with a new wooden floor and storage cupboards across the shop end wall.

This summary might sound easy but it involves a lot of complicated work particularly with the electrics. We have been very fortunate in securing funding from Coastal Waste and hope that by the time you read this Viridor will have confirmed a further grant (they have already funded part of the annex work). However, we do still need more money not only for new floor and end cupboards, but we are also planning to replace curtains, chairs and tables not to mention a bit of outside painting.

We have just written to local businesses requesting financial help and we also have a couple of further grant applications submitted. We remain hopeful that we will raise enough money to produce a village hall that we can all be proud of and which will serve us well for a few decades to come. Needless to say, any offers of financial help at this stage would be most gratefully received by the Hall Committee and Development Team.

HAPPY EASTER!!!! Easter Sunday 1st April. Ever wondered why it's called 'Good' Friday?

On Good Friday we remember the day Jesus willingly suffered and died by crucifixion as the ultimate sacrifice for our sins (1 John 1:10).

Why 'good'? Some believe it developed from an older name, "God's Friday." But regardless of the origin, the name Good Friday is entirely appropriate because the suffering and death of Jesus, as terrible as it was, marked the dramatic culmination of God's plan to save his people from their sins. In order for the good news of the gospel to have meaning for us, we first have to understand the bad news of us as sinful people under condemnation. A 'just' God would be fair in acknowledging the good and punishing the bad in our lives, as would any judge. And because God *is* fair, perfect people can spend eternity with Jesus in joy and contentment, and all those who sin require punishment – death and suffering for eternity.

But I can hear you saying: "But isn't God a loving God?

Yes, he is and He never intended us to live like this. Mankind broke away from the relationship with Him in the Garden of Eden and caused this situation. But God loves us so much that he knew a way that He could save us (reunite with us), without 'breaking' the laws that make him 'just'. He needed to 'justly' pay for our sins. Someone innocent could willingly choose to take our punishment, which works in our legal system still today.

So then Jesus, who loved us so much, was willing to take our punishment upon himself, and we can walk free, if we choose to accept this gift. (John 3:16) T Good Friday marks the day when wrath and mercy met at the cross. That's why Good Friday is so Good.

Why do we celebrate Easter? Good Friday is followed by Easter, the glorious celebration of the day Jesus was raised from the dead, heralding his victory over sin and death and pointing ahead to a future resurrection for all who are united to him by faith (Romans 6:5). If you study the various resurrection theories, you will find that the evidence (or more, the lack of evidence) is proof that he did come to life again. And in doing so, he shows us that a physical death is not the end for us, but that our souls will be with him (or not) for eternity. Easter is about celebrating 'New life': A chance of a new life with Jesus:

Easter is about celebrating 'New life': A chance of a new life with Jesus: peace, joy, love, patience, gentleness etc (Gal 5) for eternity from now. A chance to live a life free from guilt.

We represent that with things that remind us of new life: eggs, bunnies, spring time etc (hence the chocolate).

We had a most interesting talk on the 3rd March by Chris Woodward. The subject was The Jurassic Coast, which is a UNESCOHeritage Site covering the distance of 95 miles from Exmouth to Studland. Films were shown to illustrate how over millions of years ago the continents were joined together - the coalfields of Wales were connected to coalfields in North America - the pebbles at Sidmouth and Budleigh Salterton originate from France. There is 17 miles of Chesil Beach, then the limestone of Portland Bill and the chalk of Studland where sometimes bits of black flint may be found, which are the remains of dead sponges going back to the end of the Cretaceous period 66,000,000 years ago.

We have a boat trip planned in July from Exmouth along the coast to Sidmouth and will be able to look out for the layers of rock in the cliffs and enjoy looking at the coastline from the sea.
