Pynes Community Orchard: We are pleased to report that the Parish Council has agreed Head of Terms for an Option to Purchase for the Orchard. Remedial pruning work was undertaken on 13 January 2019 on the existing apple trees, led by Charles Staniland, with a group of volunteers. This was an open session and the working group are hoping to hold more Open Days during February and March. The working group met on Monday 21 January 2019 at 6pm.

Weir Meadow: Representatives of the Church Commissioners met on 3rd December 2018 with the chairman of Ide PC and the Weir Meadow working group, and we are now actively investigating feasibility of two alternative agricultural access routes to the Northern Fields, which would avoid having to share the current entrance gate; and we are now taking professional advice on applying for planning permission for recreational use. The working group met on 15 January 2019. **Minutes of both working groups** are available of the website. www.idevillage.org.uk

Renaming of C50: plans are now in hand for the change of name to Ide Village Road, with new signage and confirmation of new postcode.

Greater Exeter Strategic Plan: a meeting was held in Alphington on 11 January 2019 and it is reported that the plans for the new Matford housing development are on hold until improved plans for the infrastructure for schools, open space and medical services are debated more thoroughly.

SAFE ROUTES FOR IDE

On behalf of Safe Routes for Ide we would like to say a big thank you to all the officers involved in the recent police action to protect legitimate users of Balls Farm road from the high volume of traffic using the route illegally.



The police have reported that resourcing increased with each operation due to the volume of traffic to be managed and they were still unable to stop all offending vehicles. The number of OSCO's issued only reflects approximately 30% of the traffic contravening the regulations in place. There were 13 Police officers and staff on the ground on the most recent deployment.

A big thank you also to the volunteers from Safe Routes for Ide who helped with a traffic survey in November 2019 to see the effects. The Police action has been very effective and has improved conditions on the road for villagers walking and cycling into Exeter. Unfortunately even after such a dramatic improvement, the level of traffic is still higher than it was when community campaigns for a permanent solution first started and the traffic restrictions were put in place. It is also clear that police enforcement cannot provide a permanent solution to the problem.

Safe Routes for Ide will continue to work with the support of local residents, Ide Parish Council, the Police and concerned local councillors to achieve a permanent solution to the problem.

On a windy Sunday morning in the middle of January, Charles Staniland from Orchard Link led an apple tree pruning 'teach-in' in Pynes Orchard, as part of the restoration of the orchard. This was the first community event we've held and it was great fun, with lots of advice and tips – with the aim this year to thin out each tree by pruning out dead wood, reducing crowding and encouraging new growth.

We tackled eight trees with another six still to do - but we feel much more confident now about what we're doing. Work since before Christmas has focused on clearing dead trees and brambles and having a general tidy up - including the removal of an abandoned freezer full of food which must have been there for years!





We have a Facebook page (Pynes Community Orchard) where you can find some lovely images of the Orchard from above filmed by Simon Rice - huge thanks to him - and also keep up to date with things. You will be aware from the regular updates in the Ide Times that the Parish Council has begun a process to purchase the orchard, for the Community, from the Church Commissioners. They are making good progress with this. A prospectus is being produced to help with fund raising, and there will be a village event in early Spring to 'launch' the project. There's a lot to do but it's good way to spend a few hours!

Life and times in 19th Century Shillingford


