

I first met John when I joined Ide Aloud and enjoyed his playing for the choir and the impromptu singing sessions in the pub and at Ide Aloud parties. From those, he, Chris Goldsmith, and Chris Coles invited me to join their singing evenings. Fuelled by Chris G's prosecco we found shared musical interests; whatever songs we randomly thought of and started to sing, John always knew the guitar intro, chords and instrumental break. We started with covers of songs from the likes of Neil Young, Johnny Cash and Buddy Holly, as well as a lot of reminiscence, stories and laughter, but in the last year we've focused almost exclusively on John's own songs, which arrived first in a trickle and then in a torrent, whether blues, folk, gospel or a tribute to an iconic act. Lyrically his songs managed to use conversational language and unusual vocabulary to add humour – I defy you to find many songs using words such as laconic, nonchalant and iconoclast! Singing them was always a treat, and when we performed at the Teign House acoustic night in Christow we always grinned from start to finish. (And only sometimes because he forgot the instrumental break or ended the song in a completely different way from the one we'd rehearsed.) Weekdays are strangely empty without our singing evening, and I feel so sad that his song writing potential was cut off so soon after it had really got into its stride. CLIMATE EMERGENCY

A small group of enthusiasts has been meeting in the poachers to see what we can do next with our Climate and Nature Emergency. There are lots of things already happening in the village, we want to celebrate all that, and lots more we could do. We are finding funding opportunities, and initiatives that we could easily follow such as "Plastic free Ide". So we are collecting this information together in a new page on the village website <u>http://idevillage.org.uk/climate-emergency/</u> Have a look and tell us if you can help, or have more ideas. We are hoping to become an official working group of the Parish Council soon, and we will be pushing ahead with all these projects, to see which ones fly.

"The Ide Primary Green Team enjoyed a trip to the 'Energy from Waste' plant in

Exeter. Demelza Annison showed us how the plant converts our black bin waste into energy through an oscillating kiln, burning at 850 degrees (the same temperature as molten lava!). The steam from this powers a turbine which then produces enough electricity to power 1 in 10 houses in Exeter every day! The gases given off by burning the rubbish is treated to make the air pollution minimal. The by-products are also reused to make bricks or road surface materials.



It was a really informative and interesting trip and we all learnt a lot about what happens to our waste."



We also had our waste audit today and since the last one in November we have, as a school, **saved 15 kilo's of rubbish a week**, **reduced waste per pupil per day by 20%**, and before **we were recycling 9% of our school waste and now we are recycling or composting 29%**!



Still more to do but we will doing more to reduce waste next year!

Swifts. June 2019



The number of swifts that returned to Britain from their wintering grounds in Africa this spring was the lowest since records began, with poor weather in the Mediterranean delaying their arrival by two weeks. Experts fear the recent wet weather will further hit their numbers. Swift numbers in Britain have fallen by more than 50% since 1995.

More than 100 walks, talks and visits to urban areas in the UK to witness the swift's aerial "screaming parties" will be held this week to raise awareness of the plight of this unique migratory bird.

Nick Brown, a coordinator of Swift Awareness Week, which starts on Saturday, said: "The very cool and wet weather we have had for most of May and June does not suit swifts. They are either incubating their eggs or trying to feed small young and they need warm, dry conditions to find the insects and spiders floating in the air on which they feed.

Why swifts are amazing

Here are some reasons why they're so fantastic:

- After leaving the nest where they hatched, they'll keep flying non-stop for three years!
- They even eat, mate and sleep in the air they can 'snooze' with one side of their brain at once, and then switch to the other side
- Some of 'our' swifts migrate as far as South Africa for winter
- Parent swifts gather insect snacks for their chicks, carrying as many as 1,000 at once. Gulp!
- Swifts like to live in our houses and churches they squeeze through tiny gaps to nest inside roofs.
- At dusk, groups of swifts fly around at high speeds, screaming.

Next month there will be another article in the Ide Times with more information about what we can do in the village to help the swifts.

JUBILEE CLUB

On June 10th we had a talk by Chris Robillard about **Devon War Heroes W.W.2**.

Chris's grandfather was a French Canadian Lumberjack who came to Stover in 1916, chopping down trees for W.W.1 He joined the army and his regiment went to the Somme. His Father was born in 1919 at Torquay, left school at 14 and worked for the Coop. as a butcher for 20 years. In 1939 he was called up and joined the Devonshire Regiment posted at Devonport in charge of the fuel depot, a most dangerous target for the Luftwaffe ,and at night he drove ambulances.

He was issued with fur boots and leather boots and posted to Norway but the Germans got there first, so they were then issued with salt tablets and sent to Egypt. He spent 5 days in Dubai - sheer heaven with fresh fruit and time to swim but that was not to last. He ended up in Tobruk with 30,000 other allied troops where they came under heavy fire from the Germans the order was given to destroy all weapons the captain gave him the keys of the safe with the instructions to destroy all the personnel documents and money, £30,000.

They were rounded up and marched 7 miles to the airport which was used as a P.O.W. enclosure they had no food water or clothing, where they were held for 3 days. They were to experience much hardship, a sea journey to Naples imprisoned in the hold of a boat and moved to various prison camps across Italy. He went from 14stone down to 7stone. The Italians pulled out of the war in 1943 and the prisoners were to be moved to Germany. He managed to escape with 3 others and did a 4 month trek across Northern Italy. A local family gave them shelter and they were kept hidden while working on a farm for 18 months.

However disaster struck in April 1945 when they were captured , he was taken to the Gestapo who thought he was a spy due to his knowledge of languages and put in a condemned cell. Fortune was on his side when he was interviewed by an officer who had lived in Torquay before the war and Chris`s father had delivered meat to this German Officer who recognised him.. The Officer said I cannot set you free but can send you to a P. O.W. camp. The end of war in Europe was to come on May 8th 1945 and on May 15th they boarded a Norwegian ship bound for England.



The classes will cost £5.50 for a block booked session of 6 or £6.50 pay as you go. The first session is FREE!!!


