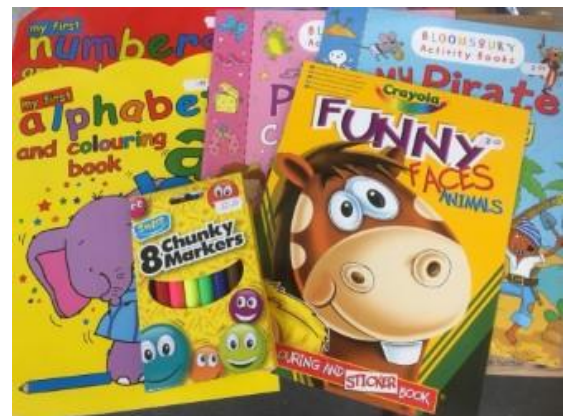

PARISH COUNCIL: CLIMATE EMERGENCY WORKING GROUP

The Parish Council now has a Climate Emergency Working Group, formally accepted at the Council meeting of 10th July.

To help us get started on our carbon reduction plan, some of us attended a Transition Exeter event on 18th July together with about 50 representatives of district, Town and parish councils. After inspiring talks from Totnes Council's Jaqui Hodgson and our own Andy Swain, we broke into subject groups to share ideas on:

- travel
- buildings/energy
- lobbying higher levels of government
- biodiversity and land use
- carbon footprint measurement.

We will be meeting monthly to turn our ideas into meaningful action. This will include identifying sources of funding for community projects that will hopefully make being green more affordable for everyone.

Swifts

In last month's article I mentioned that Swift numbers have decreased substantially this year.

What can we do in Ide to help?

Swifts need to catch insects to feed themselves and their young. There is considerable concern at the decrease in insect populations around the country and therefore the animal species that are dependent on them.

We can all encourage insects by providing insect habitats in our gardens and encouraging wildflower areas in the village.

In your gardens have a mix of wildflowers, grow a mix of trees and shrubs, look after mature trees, have a pond in your garden, leave a dead wood pile.

Only use pesticides when you really need to. Their use kills many bugs and insects and their residues get into our waterways, killing the young of insects that lay their eggs in water.

Swifts like high, deep crevices to nest. They love to nest in the eaves of our buildings. With a lack of eaves in modern buildings we can help by fixing wooden swift boxes to the outside of our homes: the RSPB website has lots of helpful tips:

"Bum Deal" for Northern Forests



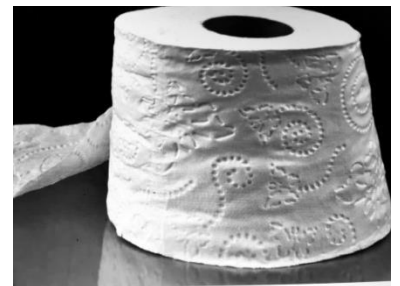
The average British consumer gets through 127 rolls every year. But The popularity of 'luxury' quilted toilet roll is fuelling the use of virgin wood pulp and contributing to unnecessary deforestation.

Large parts of Sweden's Great Northern Forest are under threat from the timber industry's growing demand for virgin wood. This has led to population declines in hundreds of forest species, with logging currently believed to be having significant negative impacts on over 1,300 red-listed (threatened) plants, animals, fungi and lichens.

"There is no need to cut down forests to make toilet roll, yet this is precisely what is happening," said Alex Crumbie, a researcher for Ethical Consumer. "With consumer attention focused on plastic, some of the big brands have slowed and even reversed their use of recycled paper in the toilet rolls they make." Major brands are using less recycled paper than in 2011, while only five of the nine major supermarkets (the Co-op, Morrisons, Sainsbury's, Tesco and Waitrose) offered an own-brand recycled toilet paper.

Although scare stories were once circulated about the dangers of the chemicals used to recycle paper, new research reveals that the chemicals used in the production of recycled paper are far less toxic than those used to bleach virgin pulp.

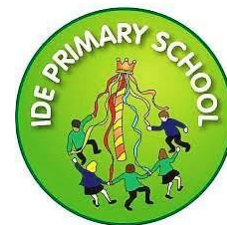

A Welcome Return

Following Andy Bragg's interesting article on Swifts in last month's Ide Times, we are most pleased to report that a pair of swallows have reoccupied an old nest in our car port this year and have produced a clutch of 4 chicks who fledged about a week ago. We had annual swallow visitors for many years from about the time that the farm buildings in Drake's Farm were demolished. We had noticed that swallow numbers have been declining in the village and our annual visitors stopped coming 3 or 4 years ago. We had thought it unlikely that we would see them again.

After a lengthy pairing process 'our' pair made a fairly late start in breeding but have been successful. It is a delight to have 6 swallows zooming around the yard instead of just the two parents. We now wait to see if they have left enough time to produce a second clutch - two is fairly normal and they will sometimes manage three. The village Martins also appear to have been quite successful this year and sometimes the skies seem full of them.

WEST TOWN FARM NEWS

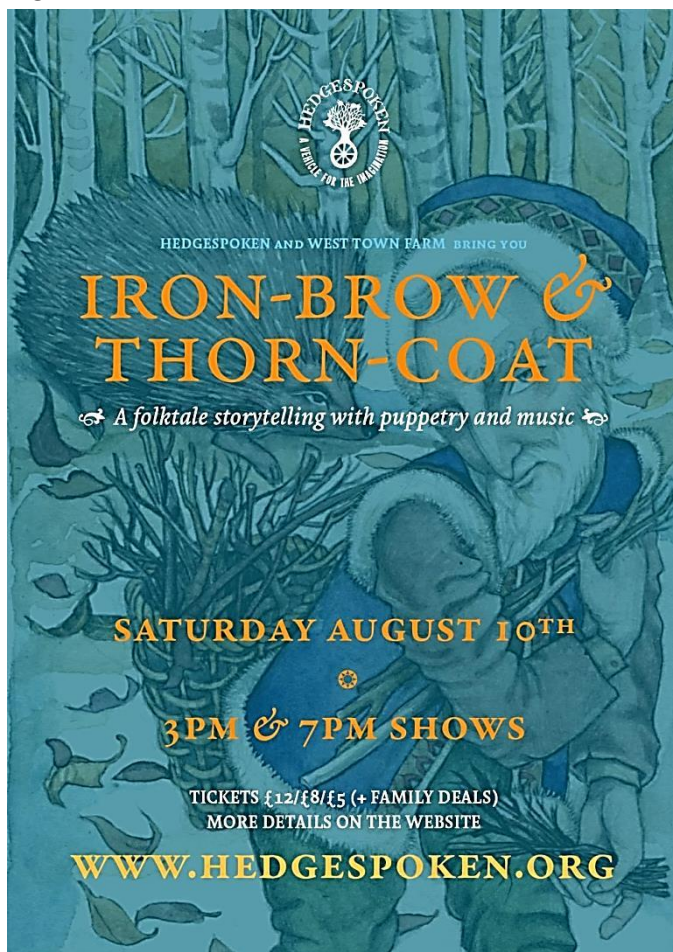

You have to get the corners tight together and the base solid otherwise the tower is going to fall over. It was a good team building activity!

Our educational visits went really well this month. We talked about organic farming and the life cycles of nature and wildlife. We're really trying to engage with the children to think about where their meat comes from.

The flies are out in force on the farm again. It's a constant battle with the sheep. We have to spray them with citronella to deter the flies from laying eggs on the animals. It's the downside of the lovely weather and poop everywhere on the farm which flies obviously love.

August brings it with it our last wedding. They've flown by this year. Lot's of happy couples and as of yet not a rainy day in sight. I've probably tainted the last one now!
