New Parish Councillor

On 18 September 2019, two candidates had applied for the vacancy on Ide Parish Council. Paula Burton-Perrett was duly elected by the Council, and co-opted as a Parish Councillor. She was warmly welcomed and joined the councillors for the meeting.

Flood avoidance. With autumn here and its fall of leaves and other debris, the Emergency Planning Working Group advise residents to keep gratings and roadside gutters clear outside their houses to avoid flash flooding.

Parking problem. Following two recent incidents when an agricultural and an emergency vehicle were unable to pass between parked vehicles in Fore Street, local farmers have written to ask residents and visitors to park tight to the curbs on each side of eastern Fore Street to allow large traffic through.

Pynes Community Orchard: The working group met on 12 September 2019. The first planting of new fruit trees will begin in January. Andy Bragg has ordered fifty apple and four pear trees, including traditional Devon varieties. The volunteer group will meet to help with planting and putting in protective post and wire surrounds. The cost of the trees and their protection has been met by earmarked donations. The Working Group is preparing a layout plan to provide space for picnic and social areas, separate from the areas planted with fruit trees. It has the potential to become a spectacular asset for the village. Next meeting is on 7 November 2019 at 6pm at The Halt, 1 St Ida's Close. Chairman Peter Cloke: peter cloke@btinternet.com.

Weir Meadow: The working group met on 19 September 2019. An offer has been made to buy the Northern Fields from the Church Commissioners as a means of removing the conditions of agricultural access across Weir Meadow, and so freeing the way to our plans for making a recreation and sports ground there. The next meeting is on 28 October at 7pm in The Hub.

Climate Emergency: The monthly working group welcomed new members James Romain, Ann Boyce, Pip Smithson and Richard Cottle to its last meeting. The group helped run a public meeting with Transition Exeter in July. There were presentations from Ide and Totnes councillors about actions that parish and town councils can take. Last week the group arranged a talk from the inspiring Audrey Compton on the value of wildflower meadows. We will be working with the school to encourage safe and sustainable travel to school, continuing to promote safe walking and cycling routes to the village. There is a new bus service the "L Bus" serving Crossmead directly, offering a faster option for accessing Ide without winding through St Thomas on the P bus. Meetings will be held at 3 Cobbe House and thereafter on the 1st Wednesday of the month. Chairman: Andy Swain andy.swain.council@gmail.com

We also have good old Heinz Tomato Soup for a bit of tradition as well as the favourite flavours of mushroom and chicken or there are dried soup mixes in the shop too. Nothing goes nicer with soup than a freshly baked roll and the shop carries a wide range of part baked bread and rolls.

For a more hearty meal what about a Kenniford Sausage Hotpot - the shop stocks lovely big thick Kenniford Sausages, as well as the thinner chipolatas - all produced locally from outdoor reared pork with very few food miles and high welfare standards.

Don't forget we can always order any fruit and vegetables that you need. Order up to 5pm the day before and they will be there when the shop opens the next day.

For pure comfort food we do both Clive's and Chunks pies for a pie and mash supper. Again both locally produced and a wide range of flavours stocked – something for all tastes – meat eater or veggie.

It was good to join in with the Village Produce Show the other week and be part of a great village event. What a lovely day, so much talent in the village with all the growing, making, baking, brewing, arranging and creating. It was nice to chat to everyone about the shop and see people join in so enthusiastically with our guess the sausage flavour competition, cheese tasting and guess the number of the sweets in the jar competition. Well done to those who won the competitions and the vouchers in the draw.



We are delighted to have some more volunteers coming on board, we are sure you will love your stints in the shop and really enjoy it. SWALLOW TALES - Chapter 3

Four fine young swallows took to the wing just yesterday (17th September). It is always amazing that they can transform to this from an egg in less that a month. Hopefully this has not left it a bit late as they will now have to get strong enough to depart for a flight all the way to South Africa sometime within the next month. The parents will also need some recuperation after the rigours of feeding four hungry chicks. The migration involves a 6,000 mile journey which they break into around 200 miles a day flying at about 20 mph. It is a hazardous journey which can involve crossing the Sahara Desert and many do not make it.

'Our' two adult swallows have now become a family of ten after two successful clutches. We can only hope that a good number of them will manage to return next spring to increase the depleted swallow population in the village.

BUS TRAVEL FROM IDE

We all know the importance of reducing car use and one way to do this is to take the bus. Here are two tips you may not be aware of which might make bus travel easier from Ide:

- you can get multi-journey tickets on the Ide Bus. Just ask the driver for a 10 journey multi ticket. These can be used by more than one person (eg if travelling with a friend) and have no time limit. Country Bus don't seem to publish this on their website but the price is about £12.50 for an adult and about £8.80 for a child (don't quote me on the price!)
- There is a new bus run by Stagecoach, the "L bus" which runs from Crossmead (at the top of Little John Cross Hill), straight down Cowick Street and up the High St, then on to Beacon Heath, without or the wiggling about of the "P bus". It runs Monday to Saturday roughly every half an hour. Weekdays it runs from 7:30am to 17:45am.
 Coming out of town the last one leaves Exeter High Street at 18:22 (Saturday timetable slightly shorter hours). Full timetable available on the Stagecoach website

SAFE ROUTES FOR IDE

We have been working with Ide Parish council and Devon County Council, who are funding a cctv survey on our sensitive local lanes to assess the levels of traffic. With West Exe School back now, we have more cyclists and pedestrians including children, and sadly a lot more traffic again.

CLIMATE EMERGENCY WORKING GROUP

I read the Committee on Climate Change's Net Zero Technical Report, which was published in May to advise the government on how to achieve zero CO2 emissions by 2050. The Committee is an independent body.



Before reading this I was very pessimistic about

the possibility of reaching net zero, given the high-consumption, high-travelling lifestyle we've all got used to. But the report goes through every sector of the economy showing easier and harder options for reduction, calculates what can be done and shows that this is definitely achievable as long as we start to make the changes right now.

There are things that all of us can do but by far the biggest change needed is the de-carbonisation of our electricity supply alongside moving to electricity for our transport, heating and cooking. The report advises government-backed contracts for new solar and wind, and for coal powered generation to stop altogether, which it hasn't yet.

Most of the UK's heating systems would need to switch to electric heat pumps and early uptake on this is important, as well as early uptake of electric cars. HGVs would need to run on hydrogen fuel, with buses either electric or hydrogen.

There's a lot more in the report, which is very thorough and surprisingly hopeful.

So what can we in Ide do?

The Working Group is looking into electric car charging points for the village and will soon be investigating electric heat pumps – how to make these accessible and affordable.

We can write to or meet our MP to make the case that the government urgently needs to follow the recommendations in this report that it commissioned. We can use our vote to only vote for parties that would take these recommendations seriously. We can all make our own small changes and also keep the pressure on for the big changes, locally, nationally and globally.


Tea (and Father Christmas) on Saturday, 7th December, and wreath making on 8th December.



THE MYSTERY OF COWICK STREET

Walk west along Cowick Street and you come to the ancient church of St Thomas. Below the first window facing the road is a large, white stone plaque with a cross at the top. But this is no grave stone. This is a memorial to the heroism of Grace Darling in 1838.

In 1838 Exeter was a prosperous Cathedral City but there was no electricity or telephone in those days. It was the end of the Regency period with the universal penny post and the railway system soon to arrive. In June of that year an 18 year old young woman became our Queen for the rest of the century.

In 1838 up in Northumberland, on the edge of the wild North Sea, Grace Darling lived with her father, who was the keeper of the Longstone Lighthouse on the rocky Farne Islands, again without electricity or phones. Even a National Lifeboat Institution was still to be established and powerful lights were things of the future.

In 1838, September 7th, there were huge storms in the North Sea. The paddle ship SS Forfarshire was driven onto rocks in the Farne Islands. Seeing there were people still alive, Grace and her father risked their own lives by rowing out in their tiny cobble. Despite the stormy seas they saved 9 people from certain death. Grace was hailed as a national heroine and she received a letter from the young Queen Victoria. Sadly Grace died from TB in 1842.



2019 - The Mystery. How come this white memorial stone is here in Exeter? The Farne Islands are 400 miles away but the memorial has been refurbished three times. The stone itself gives some clues. Erected in 1845, by kind permission of the Vicar and Churchwardens, it has been restored by subscription in 1869, 1911 and 2003.

What has been the connection between Grace Darling in the Farne Islands and St Thomas' Church in Cowick Street, Exeter, for the last 174 years?
