

IDE PARISH COUNCIL

We are saddened by the loss of John Smart who died on 24 October 2019, who was a parish councillor for more than 30 years. John was still a serving councillor up to the elections in May of this year. We shall miss his wealth of experience and history he brought to the council meetings.

Parking issues. Two items on the agenda this month again highlighted problems with parking. Firstly, in Fore Street, where parking on both sides can make it difficult for larger vehicles to pass. Secondly, residents of The Hams have sought advice about easing the pressure on parking at the cul-de-sac end. Andy Swain has produced a factual briefing document outlining the situation (available on the website and a copy is on the noticeboard). On-street parking and traffic issues are not within a parish council's remit to investigate or resolve, but we can seek information and make representations on residents' behalf. The council undertook to write to Devon County Highways to outline the problems experienced recently, and ask for their assessment and advice about the issues in Fore Street and The Hams.

Planning Applications:

19/1947/FUL IDE Land at NGR 290972 090078, Polehouse Lane - erection of a grain store.

The committee did not oppose this application, but added comments concerning the power supply to the building and hoped that, in line with local Climate Emergency policies, solar panels at this site would be considered.

19/01896/ Ide Blacksmith Cottage, 1 Fore Street – single storey extension. Refurbishment of existing rear extension including new doors and windows, and re arrangement of existing PV panel on roof.

The property has a flying freehold. The extension roof light would be directly below the sole window of the bedroom in the adjoining property. This concerned the committee, as this window is understood to be the designated fire exit for that bedroom. This would involve the occupants climbing onto the skylight and solar panel on the roof below, in an emergency. The skylight in the extension would also throw a bright light into this bedroom to the detriment of the sleepers in the bedroom above. For these reasons the committee felt unable to support the proposal.



Safe Routes for Ide

There was a great turn out for the first accompanied walk from Ide to West Exe school. A big Thank you to Chloe Fox and other Staff, students, parents and all others who supported it.



- The purpose is to raise awareness that this road is no motor vehicles except for access at all times.
- Teach the students to ride and walk defensively, and encourage them to walk and not be driven.
- Record any drivers who are rude, aggressive or antisocial. It was great to be able to use this road safely this morning, and to promote this beautiful route which is being used each year by more and more illegal traffic trying to bypass congestion on the main roads. If we lose these lanes as safe cycle and pedestrian routes, Ide will become cut off as an island community accessible only by car. That is not the future we want for our village or our expanding city and it is not the way to respond to climate emergency declarations.



For over 24 years, St Petrock's has been the first point of contact for people who are homeless, or vulnerably housed, in Exeter and surrounding areas. Our centre in Cathedral Yard is both the heart of our services and the gateway to specialist service providers. In 2017/18, 463 individuals accessed our drop-in services at St Petrock's centre and 243 people were supported into accommodation.



REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY SERVICE IDE 2019

The first Armistice Day service was held 100 years ago in 1919. Services throughout the country have been held every year since and in 1946 the nearest Sunday to the 11th November was named Remembrance Sunday. The service at Ide is held around the war memorial and was taken by our Mission Community Lay Reader, Lesley Phillips-Cannon. This year over 90 people attended of all ages, from toddlers in push chairs to a few who had fought in the Second World War. Even three workman in hi-vis vests stopped what they were doing and joined us.

At 11am the two minute silence was marked at the beginning and end by the sounding of a replica of a World War officers' infantry whistle. The roll of honour was then read by two of the younger members of those present. Harry and Lysander Robson Ives. Wreaths were laid by Rachel Herbert behalf of the Parish Council. the grand-



daughter of John Edwin Voysey and Peter Satterly in memory of Augustus Alfred Satterly. The service ended with singing the first verse of the National Anthem followed by a blessing.

Afterwards many people moved to the Memorial Hall, adjacent to the war memorial, for refreshments. It was here that the sombre mood lifted and people chatted about the medals proudly being worn and stories were exchanged as the community of this small English village all came together to remember and honour such an important day in our history.


