Pynes Farm Yard: In the next few weeks Deloitte, the agents acting for the Church Commissioners (who own Pynes Farm), intend to submit their planning application for the re-development of Pynes Farm Yard. Originally it was their intention to hold a public meeting at which they would present their final plans. However, they now feel that the information in the Ide Neighbourhood Plan, plus the Parish Council's response to their summer 2019 pre-application submission to TDC (Parish Council minutes 18 Sept 2019) enable them to proceed with a formal full planning application. Once that planning application is submitted, notice will be given on the Idevillage.org.uk website, and it will be discussed in public at a full Parish Council Meeting. As with all planning applications, members of the public are invited to make their comments to Teignbridge District Council's Planning Department. This can be done by a variety of methods.

PLASTIC FREE IDE

As of November 2019, Ide became the 557th community in the UK to begin working towards plastic free status under the Surfers Against Sewage guidelines, to reduce plastic use and overall unnecessary waste.

Surfers Against Sewage are a non-profit organisation set up in 1990 by British surfers, whose main aim is to rid our oceans of plastic, and improve the biodiversity and welfare of marine wildlife. In 2018 they set up a program to involve communities in their work and unite people into improving their hometown and in turn, having a



knock-on effect in improving the global environment.

There are 51 trillion tonnes of microplastic is present in our oceans, too small to be removed, becoming food for fish and bioaccumulating up in food chains, affecting more or less all species in our oceans as well as ourselves; as 1 in 3 fish caught for human consumption contains plastic. In just 2 years 81 communities have been declared plastic free, ridding their lives of unnecessary plastic. We wish for Ide to become the 82nd.

So, what does a Plastic Free Ide entail? It involves working hard individually and as a community to change the way we consume, by taking more careful consideration when purchasing and asking ourselves, 'Do I need it?', 'What will happen to it?' and Where will it go once, I'm done?'. It also means supporting local businesses who share similar ethical values, buying produce from local sources and buying vegetables, cheese and meat free from plastic packaging.

However, no one changes overnight, start simply by making small changes at home perhaps, saving old plastic bottles to re-fill or re-cycling correctly, even if it takes a little longer. Ide aims to go a step further and focus on all waste not just plastic, clearing our lives of unnecessary junk and plastic-coated commodities.

We would love to know what you; your family, business, school or social group are doing so that we can celebrate these accomplishments and establish any gaps in which we can improve on as a community, we would also love to hear of any ideas you may have in helping Ide become number 82. Making 2020 plastic free.

FOOD WASTE & FOOD INSECURITY

Last month's Ide Times highlighted some of the problems with household food waste in our country. Many of you will know me as a member of staff working behind the Post Office counter in the Community Shop. When I am not doing that, I work for an local charity called Exeter Food Action. We rescue food that would otherwise be discarded (by retailers, food producers and wholesalers), and redistribute this food to organisations that feed people in and around the city.

The system of food production and distribution in the UK has a significant amount of surplus built into it. In addition, our stringent food safety guidelines (largely a good thing) result in a lot of food being discarded while it is still safe to eat. Thankfully there is now some public conversation about abolishing 'Best Before' dates and only keeping the 'Use by' dates, which is the date beyond which food cannot be sold legally.

Charities like Exeter Food Action have moved into this gap, trying to rescue as much good quality food as possible and giving it to other charities that have to manage on very tight budgets. Last year we saved over 30 tonnes of edible food from going to waste. That is a lot of meals! Our warehouse on Marsh Barton provides storage for this food before it makes its way to one of the many charities signed up with us. A lot of fresh produce goes to the Exeter homeless network. Places like St Petrocks, Crossline soup kitchen and the Sunday soup kitchen in St Thomas which provide meals for some of the most vulnerable people in the city.

The Exeter Foodbank collects bread, and fresh fruit and vegetables twice a week from our warehouse for their distributions at the Mint. This gives their clients the choice of fresh food alongside the staples and tinned food. We are reaching people as far away as Dawlish, Tiverton and Paignton, through local community cafes and community fridges. Across the summer holidays we provide ingredients to several 'Holiday Hunger' schemes that are run in different locations for families with children on free school meals who may struggle during the long holidays. All our work is funded entirely through grants and donations.

Although some companies deliver directly to the warehouse, the majority of daily collections are done by our lovely band of volunteers. Quite a few of them live in this village! Since I started this job over two years ago, more than 10 volunteers have joined from Ide, including our Chair of Trustees, Nigel Walsh. They collect food from stores like M&S, Sainsbury's, Tesco and Aldi. We also receive a huge amount of seasonal produce from local growers. These seasonal gluts are shared out among organisations that provide daily meals for hundreds of people.

We are currently recruiting new volunteer drivers and driver's assistants to play a vital role in delivering food to the dozens of charities already signed up for this new service.
