## You have a new parish councillor

We were delighted to co-opt Laura Bell to Ide Parish Council at the November meeting, restoring our full compliment of nine councillors. Much of the Council's work is done outside its main meetings, by its committees and working parties who report to the Council every two months, discuss their work and seek authorisation and funds to carry out their projects. There are five such groups: Planning Committee; Climate and Environment Emergency Working Group; Pynes Community Orchard Working Group; Village Emergency Plan and Covid Working Group; and Weir Meadow \& Northern Fields Working Group. If you visit the village website you can see who serves on these groups, and what they do. Most of them are not councillors: we would like to thank them all for the time and work they put in.

Bulky waste collection service - Teignbridge District Council (TDC) has withdrawn the annual rural skip service for bulky household items like furniture, beds, fridges or metal scrap because of the cost. However, TDC offers a from-your-door collection service for household bulky items. It is chargeable, and must be booked and paid for in advance: £22 booking fee and £9 per item, max 6 items per collection.

## Wildlife Warden

The Council's Climate and Environment Working Group is going to appoint a parish wildlife warden to help support, protect and increase the village's wildlife; and rewilding the churchyard is one place they will be starting. Would you like to apply? See this link for further information -

Emergency and flood planning - Because we have an existing Village Emergency Plan, we can apply for funds for equipment. The working group hopes to establish a second store for sandbags at the northern end of the village, possibly in the Huntsman Car Park.

Cemetery - Repairs to steps and handrails in the cemetery have been completed.

Bus stop shelter - The bus shelter wood is in need of attention, and is soon to be retreated with preservative.

Baby and Toddler group - Jess Paine has secured funding from the Parish Council to re-launch Mother, Baby and Toddler group in the village hall, under Covid rules. Look out for further information.

## Planning applications

20/01991/ HOU Fordlands, The College, Ide. single storey rear extension. This application fits well within all planning guidelines: the committee voted unanimously to support it.
20/01674/HOU 2 Fore Street, Ide. single storey extension. This amended, smaller layout, has been scaled back, acknowledging the concerns from neighbours re size and loss of privacy. The Environment Agency have raised concerns regarding flood risk and the effects of a building so close to the Fordlands Brook and has asked the applicant to apply for a flood risk activity permit. Permission for a bridge across to adjacent land will also be applied for. The committee are minded to object to this application because of the concerns raised above. They have asked the planning officer to visit the site before deliberation.

20/01996/CAN 2 Fore Street Ide,. 1 ash tree to remove, 1 ash tree to reduce and 1 willow tree to remove. The committee voted to defer to TDC's Tree officer assessment.

20/00621/MAJ Pynes Farm, Ide. Conversion of four existing agricultural buildings to two dwellings, demolition of remaining barn buildings and replacement with eight dwellings including associated landscaping, parking and associated access works. We were asked to comment on some amendments recently submitted. The chair has the asked TDC for further clarification on four points: the carbon reduction footprint; Loss of parking spaces on High Street; the controlling of construction site delivery times, to avoid school drop off times; and highway safety issues encountered on entering or leaving the site.

20/00615/FUL Land opposite Chillies, College Lane, Ide. Five dwellings with garages and creation of new access. This application was discussed at an extra ordinary meeting of Ide PC held on Wednesday 9 September 2020 and unanimously voted to object

20/00623/FUL - Stevens Farm, Ide Village Road, Ide. Change of Use to Skip and Plant Park with associated hard standing. Ide Parish Council is opposed to a change of the site's use to a skip and plant park.

18/01024/MAJ Springwell Nursery, Ide. Erection of a new Garden Sales Area Building including Café and Restaurant, Storage Warehouse, New Public Car Park Area. Full council objected to this application. AWAITING A DECISION.

20/00013/FUL 49 High Street, Ide. Removal of chimney stack, insertion of roof lights and first floor side window, installation of external wall insulation and enlargement of patio doors. The committee voted unanimously to support this application. PERMISSION GRANTED
The next meeting of Ide Parish Council is on Wednesday 20 January 2021 at 7.30 pm by Zoom, unless otherwise advised.

## Ide Wildlife Conservation Group

However, we hope that in the not too distant future such a group would provide the opportunity to both improve wildlife habitats in the Parish and to get active outside.

If we are unable to collect from you on the dates shown we will get to you as soon as possible.
Cardboard - flatten or tear into smaller pieces to fit inside your green box.
Christmas cards \& wrapping - recycle your plain cards and paper-based wrapping with your card in your green box. (Shiny plastic gift wrap must be put in your black bin.)
Aluminium Foil - recycle your clean foil mince-pie cases, kitchen foil and foil lids from cream tubs in your black box.

I was asked recently why Teignbridge District Council doesn't accept plastic film in the recycling bins, so I found out. I now have a very detailed report on the current policy from the Devon Authorities Strategic Waste meeting, which I am happy to share with anyone who wants a little light reading for the weekend.

Plastic film is difficult to process because of contamination issues (with food for example) and lack of suitable markets. It makes up less than $9 \%$ of the contents of the black bins in Teignbridge. Our current recycling rate is $56.3 \%$ but we need to get that to $60 \%$ by 2025 . This is challenging when last year saw no increase, however there is a way...

Food waste makes up over 22\% of the contents of black bins in Teignbridge, a further $12 \%$ is garden waste and $11 \%$ paper. This should be going into the blue food waste, garden and paper collection. We have the facilities to recycle these, we just need to make sure it goes in the right container. We would easily meet the $60 \%$ recycling target, have more compost and, perhaps, less smelly black bins. Andy Swain

## HAPPY BIRTHDAY IDE TIMES.

45 years ago on December 1st 1975 the first copy of the magazine arrived through every door in the village free of charge as it still is today. The first month or two were rather messy using what was then the norm for printing,

## Seasonal recipe - December

Fruit and vegetables in season this month include: Apples, Beetroot, Brussels Sprouts, Carrots, Celeriac, Celery, Chestnuts, Chicory, Cranberries, Jerusalem Artichokes, Kale, Leeks, Mushrooms, Onions, Parsnips, Pears, Potatoes,
 Pumpkin, Red Cabbage, Spring Greens, Swede, Swiss Chard, Turnips, Watercress, Winter Squash.

My recipe for this month is a Thai curry with swede and greens. The key to seasonal eating is to use whatever veg you have available, for whatever dishes you normally cook. Most people think of Thai curries being made with vegetables like peppers, aubergines and mangetout but these will all be imported at this time of year. However root vegetables like swede, potato and carrots also work really well, along with squash and kale, chard or greens. This recipe uses a ready made yellow curry paste to make it simpler (I get one in an oriental supermarket called Mae Ploy) but you can also make your own.

## Thai yellow curry with swede and greens

## Ingredients

## Serves 4

- 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- 2 shallots - finely sliced
- 4 tbsp Thai yellow curry paste
- 1 red chilli - deseeded and finely chopped
- 1 swede- peeled and cut into 1.5 cm cubes
- 400 g can coconut milk
- 4 kaffir lime leaves
- 1 bunch spring greens, slice
- 1 small bunch coriander - roughly chopped


## Method

1. Heat the oil in a saucepan. Add the shallots with a generous pinch of salt and fry for 5 mins over a medium heat.
2. Add the curry paste and chilli and fry for 2 mins.
3. Add in the chopped swede then stir in the coconut milk along with 200 ml water.
4. Add the lime leaves, cover and cook for 15-20 mins or until the swede is tender.
5. Then add the chopped greens and heat for a further 5 mins or until the greens are just cooked.
6. Serve with rice and coriander sprinkled on top.

## Walking Our Lanes in Autumn

The textures underfoot - smooth tarmac, water worn surfaces, earth sticky patches, squidges of mud, leaves, stalk and twig washed into zigzagged clumps by the lane/stream. Other textures: those of intertwined, lane bank leaves smooth, glossy and pointed, serrated edges, and soft, fuzzy furls.
The smells - damp soil, pigs, horses, fungi, and the decay of once air fluttered leaves flattened into brown/green sludge by passing feet and tyres.
The bed of the brook revealed by the changing sounds of its running waters. The distinctive sounds of well known birds, the buzzard, the robin; and the cries, calls and song of those unknown to my untrained ear.

Across the valley, the lovely scrubby, tufty hillside providing food, home and hideaway; and where my eyes search for camouflaged deer. And then, the steepening fields, gradually closing in and enfolding the yellow/gold and russet, tree
 cloaked stream and lane.

Little visual gems - limpid green, crinkled, lichen on grey, rotting, wooden railing; and red berries, startlingly vibrant against emerald green, water brushed sedges. And grander visual splendours - the breadth and depth of distant hills and the aerial perspective of sharp green clarity fading to smudgy, purply, green- grey; and the accompanying fresh, hilltop breeze.

The physicality of my walk; the parts of my body responding, in their varied ways, to the gentle rise and fall of my route, to the steep hill and the long downward slope. My legs know where they are; eyes are not needed to tell me. These are the varied joys of my autumn walk.

There are occasional notes that jar, moments to spoil my contentment: the sound of a siren drifting over the hill from the city, the carelessly tossed away bottle or packet, alien in its surroundings; and the sudden shock of meeting the brutality of machine shorn hedges with their raw, snapped twigs devoid of leaves, seed heads and berries - the autumn and winter food and shelter for birds and small creatures. Does it have to be done that way? But mostly I experience great pleasure and am grateful for this walk from my doorstep.

This year is not what any of us expected and I think I can speak for everyone when I say I am looking forward to seeing the back of 2020! Looking back over the year I still can't quite believe what we have all been through. I have to

Hopefully her grammar and sentence structure will be a vast improvement on mine also. I have really enjoyed the last 4 years on the farm. It's been amazing watching it grow.

I hope everyone has a lovely Christmas and New Year. Let's hope we can get together with our families and friends in some shape or form.
