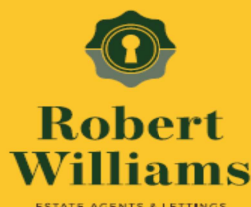

Parish Council Meetings. You can attend any Parish Council meeting - they are held in public - by joining us on Zoom; and soon, perhaps, in person when we get back into the hall. We would love you to come. And you are welcome to speak or ask questions about matters on the agenda; or suggest items for future discussion. If you don't fancy coming to a meeting, we would like to hear your views anyway on topics we discuss, or the projects we are working on. You can find out what we do on the village website. Pynes Orchard. By the time this edition is published, we will have held an extraordinary Parish Council meeting on 22 April, called to approve the signing of the Option Agreement to purchase the land. This will give the village the right to buy the Orchard at any point between now and April 2024, as soon as the funds have been raised.

Planning Matters

Decisions made in the last 4 weeks.

20/00615/FUL - Land opposite Chillies, College Lane, Ide. Five dwellings with garages and creation of new access.

Planning permission has been REFUSED by Teignbridge District Council - for the following reasons:

The proposed development would provide five new dwellings in designated open countryside, outside any defined settlement limit, with no overriding agricultural or forestry justification, and does not provide affordable housing units to meet an identified local need. The proposal is therefore contrary to Policies S22 (Countryside) and WE5 (Rural Exceptions) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013-2033, and Policy IDE01 (Residential Development in Ide) of the Ide Neighbourhood Plan 2016-2033.

The proposed siting of the development in a prominent, elevated, ridge location within an area of open countryside would further erode the distinctive rural and tranquil character of the area. Furthermore, the proposed removal of part of the existing hedgerow to form a new access and associated visibility splays, and the large scale of the proposed units and their suburban style appearance, would conflict with the rural character of the context and would have a detrimental impact upon the character and appearance of the open countryside and Area of Great Landscape Value. As such, the proposal would be contrary to Policies S1 (Sustainable Development Criteria), S2 (Quality Development) and EN2A (Landscape Protection and Enhancement) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 – 2033, and guidance within the National Planning Policy Framework.

Insufficient information has been submitted to assess the impact of the proposed development upon trees and hedgerows. As such, the proposal fails to comply with Policy EN12 (Woodlands, Trees and Hedgerows) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 - 2033.

It has not been demonstrated that the proposed development would not result in harm to protected species. As such, the proposal fails to comply with Policy EN11 (Legally Protected and Priority Species) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 - 2033. It has not been demonstrated how surface water from the development would be disposed of in a manner that does not increase flood risk elsewhere. In addition, insufficient information has been submitted with regards to how foul sewage will be disposed of. As such, the proposal fails to comply with Policy EN4 (Flood Risk) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 - 2033.

20/00623/FUL – Stevens Farm, Ide. Change of Use to Skip and Plant Park with associated hard standing.

Planning permission has been REFUSED by Teignbridge District Council - for the following reasons:

1. Due to the location of the application site within designated open countryside and within a designated AGLV, and due to the prominent position of the application site on an elevated open ridge, the proposed change of use is inappropriate for the area and fails to conserve and enhance the qualities, character and distinctiveness of the locality. As such, the proposal is contrary to Policies S1 (Sustainable Development Criteria), S2 (Quality Development), EN2A (Landscape Protection and Enhancement) and EC3 (Rural Employment) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 – 2033, and Policy IDE07 (Ide Gateway Enhancement Area) of the Ide Neighbourhood Plan.
2. The access to the site from the C50 is inadequate to serve the proposed development and is likely to result in the potential for vehicles to stack whilst waiting for the access to become clear or vehicles reversing into the carriageway. As such, the proposal is likely to result in an adverse impact upon road safety and congestion, contrary to Policy S1 (Sustainable Development Criteria) of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2013 – 2033.

To view planning applications, go to www.teignbridge.gov.uk/planning and search using the address or reference number. The next meeting of the planning committee will be held on Wednesday 5 May 2021 at 6.00pm by Skype unless otherwise notified.

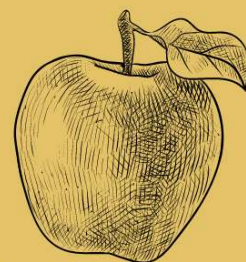
IDE MEMORIAL HALL

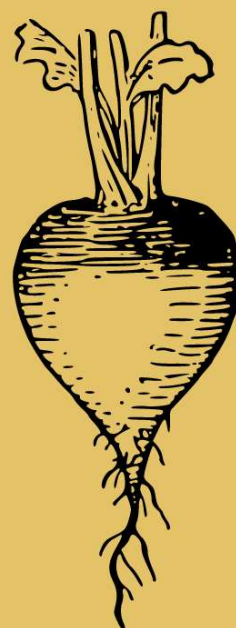

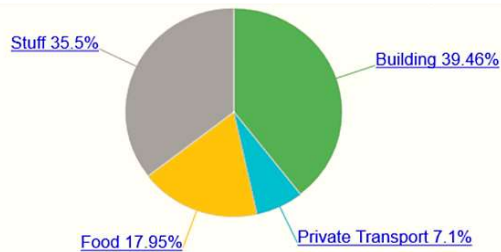
KEEP IDE TIDY

How Big is Your Carbon Footprint?

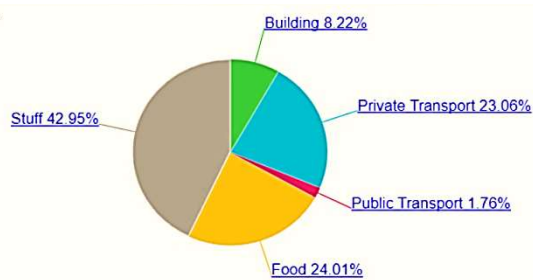
Emissions summary

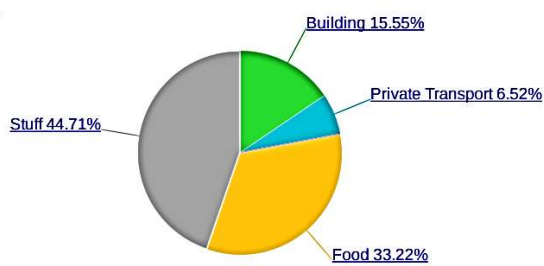
Emissions summary

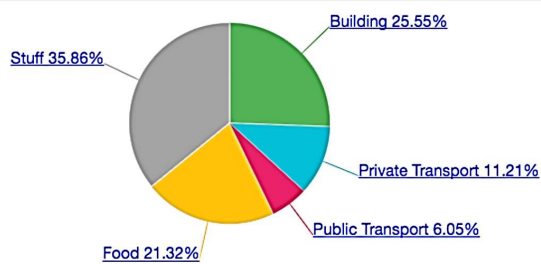
Emissions summary

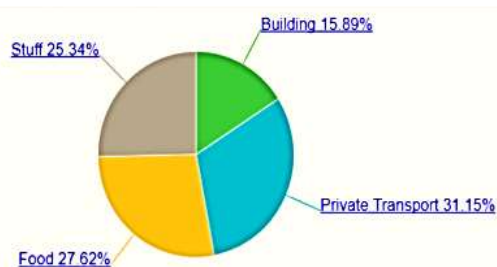

"I have finally got round to doing the carbon footprint tracker and must say I found it pretty easy to use (although I did use a few of the standard figures). I have done two trackers - one for pre-lockdown (when we had two cars and both my husband and I commuted), and one for this last year (when we're down to one car and both working from home). The tracker is really useful in highlighting how much carbon we were using from commuting and I'm just so pleased we don't have to do this now - both personally and for the planet!"

"I was really disappointed with the buildings figure as I didn't put my gas central heating on until the end of November and then I kept it low! Clearly I (and the planet) are paying the price for living on my own in a house that is now bigger than I need!. I am now determined to try to reduce my footprint in accordance with the recommended targets provided by the calculator...so I think that's a result."

"The ACT tracker remembers your values (in your local browser, not in an external server) so you can use it again next year and track progress. This is a really nice feature that others don't have. You can also export the data and pass it on if you want to, so we could let people submit it anonymously and use it for a parish footprint which would be very helpful."

In calculating your household carbon footprint the tracker does not take into account if your electricity supply is from renewables or low carbon sources. So, if this is the case, your footprint will be lower than that calculated. However, the tracker still provides an impetus to reduce energy usage, regardless if you source from renewables or not.

What I Did in Lockdown

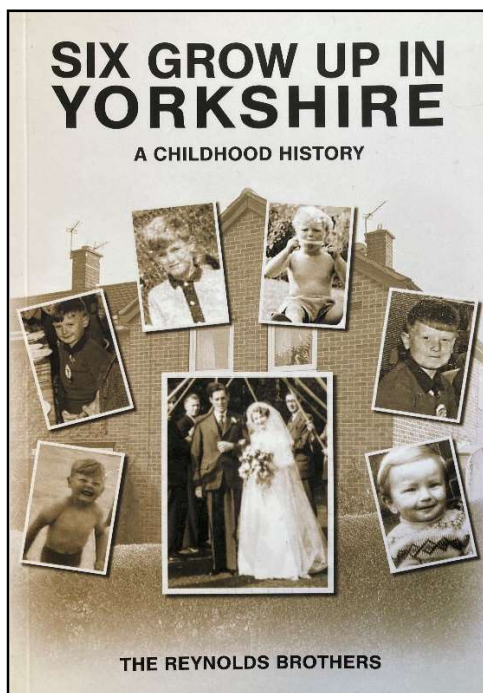
Although I have lived in Ide for the last twelve years, since moving here from Wakefield, this is not about Ide, or even Exeter. It is interesting, as we emerge from the lockdown tunnel, to think back to how we used the time it gave some of us. By last October I had got as good as I was going to get on computer motorbike racing games, but what next?

Amidst on-line family quizzes, I began talking with my five brothers, all of whom live in Yorkshire, reminiscing about our early family life. I think the reality of mortality, that covid has exposed, made us all realise we had let too much pass by unacknowledged and unrecorded. Our stock of anecdotes about parents, our council estate neighbourhood, school, relatives, holidays, Christmas, friends, pubs, becoming adults, kept flowing enthusiastically until we had enough to fill a book. So, we decided, why not write that book, mainly to be able to let our children, grandchildren and future generations know how life was 'back then', in the 50s, 60s and 70s and not lose our history. Regretfully, we have so little knowledge of our own parents' early lives and did not want the same position for our families.

There were tons of photos in lofts and drawers to add to the flavour, and I became responsible for piecing it all together into a story that we could all agree on. Not quite writing a book by committee, but not far off... We are proud of the result, though not necessarily proud of some of the antics it reveals. How can kids be like that? That lad at school who pretended to have jumped out of a two-storey window as the teacher arrived, offering your ill five-year old brother a nice glass of 'lemonade', waking up on Sunday morning in the field behind your house, being asked by the local bobby to rebuild the wall we had partially demolished.

There are some more uplifting parts though, some of which are a homage to our long-gone parents, whose lives we now realise we never found time to properly celebrate. Also, some great holidays and trips, including adventures on an old working farm in the 60s, winning the Butlins Happy Families contest numerous times, Dad's cars, and his stories of his police career, 70s fashion and music, the estate Subbuteo league, ten hour 15-a-side football games, being related to Eddie Waring (?) and much more.

We packed a lot into 200 pages, not least 260 photos and illustrations and are incredibly happy with the result, which has just been self-published. The book itself is almost a by-product, the real bonus being the six-month, and ongoing, discussion between us which has brought us all so much closer (even 'our Paul' who has just moved to Spain) and would not have happened without lockdown. I can recommend the therapy, and my next book might even be based a bit nearer!

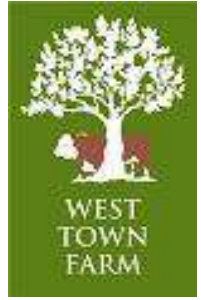
Jojo Moyes. “Me before You”, about a quadriplegic young man – funny and sad – a real page-turner. She has written a number of books – all good.

I was given his “V2” for Christmas, which is about the rockets used to bomb London at the end of WW2 and about the scientists who really wanted to develop a rocket to send to the moon, some of whom ended up in the USA at the end of the war following their dream. It is quite technical but, like a number of his other books, is a good read. Don't read his “Second Sleep” book though if you are feeling depressed!

Lee Child. “The Midnight Line” - a Jack Reacher detective thriller. Another gripping page turner, although I don't always know the American-isms – giving an insight to rural areas of the US.

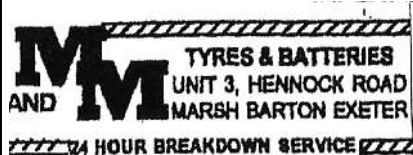
