

Planning Matters

21/01203/FUL Land at NGR 28921 90738, Ide Village Road, Ide. Use of Land for storage of inert building materials. The Planning Committee voted unanimously to object to this application on the following grounds: Whilst the applicant has proposed measures to enhance biodiversity, the site falls within Policy IDE07 (Ide Gateway Enhancement Area) of Ide Neighbourhood Plan (2018). The increased amount of storage of building materials is not in keeping with the rural environment and would have an adverse effect upon the rural approach to the village. We are concerned that this enlarged storage area would increase the number of heavily laden lorries needing to enter and exit onto Ide Village Road, which would pose a safety hazard to other road users. Ide Parish Council was informed on 21 July that this application had been withdrawn.

Funding is available to help Devon's communities reconnect, rebuild and recover

Community-led facilities and activities, like many things, were quickly suspended during the onset of the national coronavirus lockdown.

As the country begins to return to some degree of normality, Devon County Council is keen to help local communities get back to doing the things they love safely and confidently, so they've created a special fund to support them.

The Reconnect Rebuild Recover Community Fund will provide grant funding of up to £1,000 for smaller projects and between £1,000 and £3,000 for larger projects that help local people to reconnect, rebuild and recover their community-led facilities and/or social activities.

It will support community-led initiatives that:

- encourage a range of people to participate in activities that improve their physical, mental and emotional health and wellbeing
- provide safe community-led transportation links and services which encourage and help people to re-connect and re-socialise safely within their communities
- encourage people to develop skills and learning through volunteering their time, knowledge and expertise to help and support the facilities and/or social activity and the people using them

We realise that there are many new faces in the village who might not be aware of the origins of the shop (more details can be found on the village website page where the February 2021 Ide Times has the full history if you missed it) and might not have noticed this wooden plaque thanking various people and organisations that is hanging by the PO counter in the shop.

With the lifting of restrictions, we respectfully ask that if you are able, you continue to wear your facemask in the shop and sanitise your hands on entry. The shop will be

carrying on in the way we have been to safeguard both customers and volunteers and we thank you in anticipation of your help on this.

We have introduced a great new line in locally made meringues, made by Penny at Thorverton with free range eggs from Poltimore, which sold out in less than a week the first time we had them. We now stock meringue nests – small, medium and large and meringue shells and of course the local strawberries and double cream to make up a pavlova or Eton mess with them.



We have a new team member joining us in the shop in August - Pest the Seagull. We were going to do a competition to name him, but Vron called him Pest and I liked it and it stuck with me – so no longer a competition to name him – but a competition to potentially win him – if you find him. IDE SCHOOL FROM 1976 TO 1879



In this period Ide was a First School taking children from age 5 to age 8. After that we went on to John Stocker Middle School (now Bowhill) until the age of 12 and then to St Thomas High School (now West Exe). There were only 30-40 children at Ide First School when I attended – most came from the Ide and Longdown area. Those from outside the village came by school bus which came from Longdown to Ide and then on to John Stocker and St Thomas High.

I walked to school with my older sister and we were seen across the road by the Lollipop Lady, Mrs Joyce Ebdon. All the children stayed for school dinners, which were cooked in the kitchen which was part of the canteen (now the car park). Mrs Copp was the cook and she had two helpers – Mrs Parsons and Mrs Leverton. If it was your birthday you were allowed to collect up the mugs (plastic cups) and put them upside down in the wire cage which went in the dishwasher. You then received a sweet! If there was a tray bake for pudding and some was left it was brought out and distributed in the playground.

The school did not have the same security in those days but the children were supervised at lunchtime by two ladies, Joyce Stevens and Molly Pike. All the ladies mentioned above lived in Ide and they therefore knew all of us children.

A policeman used to come to the school sometimes and talk to us about road safety. We also had a dentist who came to the school with a large caravan which was plugged into the electricity supply so that he could examine and fill children's teeth if necessary. In 1977 it was the Queen's Silver Jubilee and all of the village children were given a Jubilee Mug. There were also village celebrations and a party on the school field. I can remember making butterfly cakes one day at school. The school toilets were outdoor ones in those days – not very nice – and I remember that we were once sent home because the toilets had frozen.

South West Coast 2 Coast Challenge in aid of Children with Cancer UK

I am Peter Hendy-Ibbs, a retired surgeon living in Dunchideock. By the time you read this I will have run and walked the South West Coast 2 Coast challenge on 24/25th July. I am taking on this event – 100km from Minehead to Dawlish – to raise money for **Children with Cancer UK**, the charity that funds most research into childhood cancers, trying to produce better and kinder treatments while keeping families together.



In October 2017 my four year old grandson was diagnosed with a huge lymphoma in his chest. He has recently completed three and a half years of daily chemotherapy using a cocktail of up to 9 different toxic drugs by mouth, into muscles, veins and even into his spine. It has been brutal. He has had life-threatening infections, lost his hair and needed a wheelchair at times for muscle weakness in his legs. However, he has survived and is now in remission.

Because this event is 'local' to Devon I would like to appeal to everyone living in my local villages, communities and parishes.

IDE COMMUNITY LUNCH

Thanks to everyone who has come along to Ide Community Lunch Club. We are taking a short break for summer but will be back in September and will be running on a monthly basis, on the second Friday of every month 12 - 1.30pm. The lunch club was set up to provide an affordable healthy meal for people living in Ide and the surrounding area. It is open to anyone who wants to come including older people, people working from home and families with young children, So far our guests have



ranged from about 3 years old to 90 years old. We hope to reduce social isolation by providing a safe space where people can meet up and chat with others.

The lunch club aims to reduce food waste, as most of the ingredients we use are surplus produce kindly donated by Exeter Food Action, as well as some vegetables from Shillingford Organics. We're also happy to use up anyone's surplus allotment produce or leftover veg box contents. Our busiest lunch club had about twenty four guests, and our quietest had one! (but it was our first one). We always make a fresh vegetable soup, salad, usually a dip, and a cake or pudding. We try to keep the menu as seasonal as possible, and use local and / or organic ingredients if they are available. We also get organic sourdough bread from Boatyard Bakery. Everything we cook is suitable for vegans and most of it is gluten free. We've had four amazing volunteers helping out so far - Lisa, Ali, Josie and Caroline - and Sarah who made a delicious carrot cake. . If you'd be interested in volunteering some time please get in touch.



Thanks very much to Ide Parish Council for awarding us a small grant to get essential equipment to get started. Thanks also to Ide Primary School whose pupils made us some amazing table decorations and to Liz Butland for supplying us with such great ingredients through Exeter Food Action. The lunch club is run on a pay as you feel basis, so that it's accessible to everyone. This means you pay what you feel the food is worth and what you can afford, if you can't afford anything that's fine, but if you can afford to pay a bit more this helps us cover our costs, and subsidise the cost for

everyone else. We have a suggested donation of £3 a dish, or £5 for two dishes.

We sometimes have leftovers available to buy for takeaway too. Some of our dishes made so far include red pepper, lentil and tomato soup; leek and potato soup; broad bean hummus; potato salad with peas and mint; taboulleh; lemon cake with elderflower drizzle; and chocolate and beetroot cake.
