

Teignbridge Local Plan

The District Council has just published part 3 of its draft Local Plan, for consultation. It deals with potential sites for renewable energy, gypsy and traveller communities and small residential developments. Ide features in the list of possible wind generation sites, on high ground in the south west of the parish. The plan can be read at teignbridge.gov.uk/planning/local-plans-and-policy. The consultation is open until 24 January 2022; and the Parish Council will discuss it on 19 January.

Ide Emergency Plan

Paula Burton Perrett leads the Ide Emergency Planning team. They have just revised and updated the village Emergency Plan, setting out measures to plan for and respond to flood, pandemic, snow, major road blockage or accident, and fire. The revised draft was presented to the Parish Council on 17 November, and will appear on the village website in December.

Traffic

The Parish Council remains alarmed by uncontrolled and dangerous parking at the entrance to the village; and the speed of traffic on Ide Village Road (the C50). The junction of Fore Street and Ide Village Road is subject to the triple hazard of fast traffic along the straight; parked vehicles on the pavement obscuring the exit line of sight; and vehicles parked on the road too close to the junction, causing danger for traffic coming into and leaving the village. The Devon Highways Neighbourhood Officer has visited the village at the invitation of the Parish Council. DCC are not at present minded to paint double yellow lines on the Fore Street edges of the junction; but advise that the Parish Council may place physical barriers to prevent vehicles mounting the pavement. On 17 November the Parish Council, therefore, resolved to place a number of stout wooden planters on the pavements on either side of the junction to dissuade vehicles from driving up onto the pavement. We will also continue to make representations for double yellow lines at the junction; and for a 50mph speed limit along Ide Village Road.

New Parish Councillor

We are delighted that Nick Creasy has joined the Council. We elected to co-opt him as a councillor on 17 November 2021. The Council is now back to its full complement of nine councillors. And a seasonal thank you to all the members of our five working groups, especially those who are not parish councillors: Covid-19 and Emergency Planning; Community Orchard; Weir Meadow & Northern Fields; Joint Projects Fund Raising; and Climate Emergency. Green Space for Ide

The response to the Appeal with the two brochures and leaflet, launched on 8 September, continues to be really encouraging. Along with funds raised at events, 32 donors have so far donated or pledged funds, bringing the total amount raised to date to £61,309 for both projects combined: £37,208 for Weir Meadow & Northern Fields, and £24,101 for Ide Community Orchard.

Diary date

On **Saturday**, **22 January 2022**, we will be hosting two public meetings in the village hall, from 1-2pm and another from 5-6 pm. They are for residents to hear about and discuss the Parish Council's plans to apply for a loan to raise the balance of funds to purchase Weir Meadow, Northern Fields and Victorian Orchard.

Some more FAQs about the Orchard and Weir Meadow

Q. Could the District or County Council take over the land from Ide Parish Council if they chose to?

A. No. The Parish Council is a free standing statutory body with rights to own property. It would need an Act of Parliament; and anyway there is no reason why they would ever want to.

Q. How do I know that that the Parish Council won't sell off the land?

A. A prime reason for the Parish Council's plan to buy these fields is to protect them from development by the current owners, or other people who might buy them. We want them to become recreational assets for the village community in perpetuity.

A. Weir Meadow and the Orchard are designated in planning law as recreation ground and Local Green Space respectively, which protects them from development.

A. Parish Councils, unlike County or District Councils, or the Church Commissioners, do not have significant demands on their budgets which might force the sale of assets.

20/02132/ADV Stevens Farm Ide Village Road IDE EX2 9FB. Retention of 3 advertising signs. The Planning Committee decided unanimously to object to the retention of these signs. **Awaiting decision**

We can order any meat, fruit, vegetable, dairy, and bread lines you like for the festive period. Any orders for Creedy Carver products need to be with us by the first week in December although we will be able to obtain poultry as well as other meat lines from Oinkers after this time. We can order any other lines you might need but would appreciate as much notice as possible. Please collect a leaflet from the shop giving more details on this or ask us.

The shop has a good stock of Christmas Cards together with the usual Christmas essentials of bottle bags, wrapping paper, sellotape, blue tac, etc. We stock a good range of wine for Christmas entertaining or presents and of course the local Exeter Brewery Beers and Sandford Orchard Ciders.

Shaldon Bakery are shutting down on Christmas Eve for a fortnight so please order any bread you need early from them and freeze it. We will be carrying limited supplies of frozen bread from Shaldon in the shop but will need to swap back to Ryder's Bread over this period. We will have the usual range of part baked lines as well for back up.

We will have the beautiful Poinsettias and wreaths from New Leaf at Exminster for sale in the shop again this year and it is good to support their worthwhile work when we can.

By now you will all have heard of Gordon the gingerbread man who has come to help the shop team during the build up to Christmas & will have read of some of his antics. 

JUBILEE CLUB

Being a Registrar proved to be an interesting subject.

Maureen Hunter officiates at Civil Ceremonies of marriages. She related to us some of the history of events. Thomas Cromwell, who was to later loose his head on the orders of Henry VIII th, introduced the recording of marriages in 1538 when the minimum age was 12 years. Then in 1836 the registration of marriage act was introduced, requiring 28 days notice followed by in 1929 the minimum age being raised to 16 years also needing the consent of the parents until aged 21. Remember tales of elopement to Gretna Green? On to 1987 when the minimum age without parental consent was lowered to 18.

In 1997 there were 10 registration offices in Devon, the main one part of Old Forde House at Newton Abbot, £76. the charge there, while in the main Old Forde House £500! The numbers of marriages are down, in 1929 270,000 and in 2018 235,0000, most marriages are Civil Ceremonies, the most popular month being August, 54% on a Saturday. The average age is 33 for a man and 31 for a woman, and the average cost an eye watering £27,000.

Special ink, iron gall indelible ink which contains tannic acid was used until May 2021 when the certificate became computerised. No longer was the word spinster used changed to single. Sadly 1/3 end in divorce 1/2 of these in the first 10years. Nora entertained with one of her poems.

As we attempt to live our lives with some normality an outing was arranged for November 15th. My thanks to those who were able to support us on this day, and a big thank you to Powell's coaches for their help when the destination had to be changed. Off we went to Endsleigh Garden Centre. I have been told of the extra mile a member of their staff went in helping one of our ladies with her purchase. I find the kindness of these folk so heart-warming - thank you.

Sadly I have heard of the death of Jean Wood a club member for some time.

On Sunday, January 30th 2022 from 2-4pm in the Village Hall, Ide Growers will be hosting the first 'Ide Seed Cooperative and Swap'. It'll be different and additional to the 'Plant Swap' we will hold in April because it's a chance to get or swap seeds earlier in the growing season.



How will it work?

Everyone who would like to join in pays £5 before 19th Dec 2021. We will then use all the money to buy the best range of high quality vegetable and flower seeds that we can. We will do this in advance so that they are ready for you to collect at the Seed Swap on Sunday 30th Jan.

It'll be a bit of a lucky dip, but sometimes the best gardening results are happy accidents. So, if you fancy LIVING LIFE ON THE GARDENING EDGE, then in exchange for a fiver, you'll get a wider selection of seeds than you could ever normally get for the same price in the shops. You can choose to get vegetables, flowers or both – you just need to tell us when you order.



On the day of the swap you can come along to the Village Hall to collect your order – if you can't come, don't worry, we will get it to you. There will be a large range of other seeds available on the day too, so please bring along anything that you have to swap. Now is a great time to collect seed from your garden! Everyone is very welcome to come and get these seeds, whether or not you joined the cooperative and whether or not you have anything to swap. We'll just put a pot out for donations.

There will be the usual tea and cake available of course, so it should be a lovely event for a cold January afternoon! We hope to ee you there.
