

PUBLIC MEETING - Markham Village

On Friday 3 March 2023 at 7.30pm in Ide Memorial Hall to hear about and comment on Teignbridge District Council's latest consultation draft of the Local (District) Plan 2020 -2040, published in December 2022.

Ide Parish Council discussed the plan on 25 January 2023 and decided to call a public meeting for residents, with particular reference to policy EE1, a proposal to create Markham Village – 900 houses in the parish of Ide. We have invited officers from Teignbridge District planning department to explain the plans, along with representatives from Alphington, Ide, Holcombe Burnell, Shillingford and the Alphington Forum. If you are unable to attend this meeting, please send your comments and questions to be raised with the planners to Mel Liversage, parish clerk, at ideparishclerk@gmail.com

In the previous version, Markhams Farm was put forward as a potential site. It attracted strong objections, including from Ide Parish Council citing our own Neighbourhood Plan. Markhams Farm is part of the Devon County Farms Estate, and is very high quality agricultural land. Despite a petition with over 2,000 signatures to save the county farms, this site was selected for concept planning in the new version of the plan: 900 homes, with 20% affordable, called Markham Village. Vehicular access to the site will be from the Shillingford end of Markham Lane; and from Ide Village Road through a new access road emerging at Springwell Nursery. The full plan is on the village website or the Teignbridge DC website under Local Plan 2020-2040. There are links to send your comments on the plans to TDC, and the Parish Councillors encourage as many resident as possible to express their views and comments. WASSAILING IN IDE COMMUNITY ORCHARD

On a beautiful, cold and bright evening, 5pm on Sunday 5 February, we welcomed everyone to our first Wassail. The sun was setting and a new moon rising. Around 80 residents joined in blessing the trees, placing bread in the chosen tree and sprinkling the roots with cider to encourage a good harvest. Some trees were lit. Apple cake was eaten, and the wassailers processed around the orchard singing, banging metal pots and then gathering around a fire to hear poems and readings about the Wassail.

Enormous thanks to Mark Thomas and Peter Cloke for organising the event and to their helpers, Lily Ballard, Kate Morley and Rachel Thomas. We look forward to repeating this ceremony for many years to come.

PARKING PINCHPOINT AT THE GREEN

The Parish Council received reports of two recent significant incidents caused by a car parked at the narrowest part of The Green, preventing emergency vehicles getting to The Hams. In January a fire engine could not get through to attend a house fire in the Hams; and in February, an ambulance could not get past to attend an emergency. There have also been reports of occasions when bin lorries could not get past.

The Devon Highways Neighbourhood Officer visited the spot at The Green in February and advised that it should be double yellow lined. The Parish Council has formally requested this, but it takes time to be consulted on, approved and carried out.

In the meantime, given the nature of these incidents and a concern to prevent further serious problems, the Parish Council has put down three heavy duty traffic cones, with notices requesting that cars do not park at the pinch point.

FROM YOUR DISTRICT AND COUNTY COUNCILLORS

Voting is being made harder, so it is more important that we do.

At elections in 2018 there were 8 allegations of people claiming a false identity at a polling station, seven were dismissed and one resolved locally. There were no convictions. In 2019 the government ran trials requiring photo ID to vote. In just ten trial areas, 1,968 people were turned away for not having the correct ID and 740 did not return to vote. In some areas over 0.5% of the voters were prevented from voting, that's bigger than many majorities.

Despite the total lack of an actual problem, and the shocking numbers of people disenfranchised, the government is pressing ahead with voter ID. The Elections Act 2022 will apply to the Teignbridge local elections in May 2023. All voters at polling stations must show identification documents. If you don't have a suitable ID, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate free of charge, or you can apply for a postal vote which will be sent to you in the two weeks before polling day.

Both these options need time to arrange, so don't leave it till nearer the time, do it now. There is more information about both these options at https://www.teignbridge.gov.uk/council-and-democracy/elections/electoral-services or you can contact us for assistance.

Please do not let them take away your vote.

Ide Growers held our first event of the year on the last Sunday of January with a Seed Swap. It's the second time we've run one, and it was great to see so many people from the village come along.



We were delighted over the last weeks and month to welcome three new members to the shop team Debs Stephens, Julie Skinner and Emma Ward. All who have taken to shop life like the proverbial duck to water. We just love having them as part of the team as they are all 'can do' and 'get on with anything' people and have already proved to be so handy in shop life and have covered so many shifts. It is so encouraging to have so many village folk getting involved and certainly makes David's job on the rota so much easier.

We have a new supplier for kindling – and it is a very local product coming from just up the road at Woodbury and the farmer delivers it himself to us. The nets are reusable and better than the plastic that our other source of kindling comes in. This ticks a lot of the shop boxes with the alternative to plastic and a local supplier, we will always chose to use a local suppler when we can.



For anyone looking at cutting back on their plastic use – we still have some of the Ide Cloth bags designed by Bronwyn for sale in the shop– with all proceeds going to the Weir Meadow project. We also have shampoo bars made from our local soap supplier Pavilion Soaps at Cheriton Bishop for sale in the shop which as well as eliminating plastic also make a lovely present or gift for someone.

Please do try and return the shop cloth bags when you can. Janet and her fantastic team have made over 300 over the years and most of these are in and around the village somewhere, as opposed to being back in the shop to be reused. If you have any, please could you drop them back so they can be reused when you are passing or next in the shop.

Just a reminder we can always order any special cuts of meat, fruit and vegetables or bread you need or would like. We can't carry everything in the shop but we can order a wide range of lines from our local suppliers.

We celebrated our Christmas lunch on January 23rd at Carriages. It was a happy occasion, well-attended, enjoying a delicious meal, with which was followed by the pleasure of presenting Marge Addicot with a medal from the R.V.S for 30 years volunteering. Added to this Marge was given a bunch of flowers for her 80th birthday. Then of course there was a draw, lots of super prizes donated by the lovely members . **February 6th** we had a Police officer telling us the way to avoid scams and fraud. My goodness, it is a minefield quite alien to our age group. Ellen the speaker was excellent, putting the subject over clearly and with humour.

Land lines are more likely to be the target. When you get a call claiming to be, say Amazon Prime or Windows 11, they say your name or maybe claim to be the police, and have a persuasive story to tell, maybe tell you to ring your bank, the catch here is they keep an open line, so use a mobile and ring a neighbour or family member. Scammers clone local numbers and ring from abroad.

Then there is that old story of a WhatsApp message claiming to be a family member in need of money- do not be taken in. Ignore texts, often on the back of special deals ie. winter-payment schemes. If a genuine caller, they will follow up with a letter or visit. If you buy on the Internet, use a credit card, you can then get your money back. Mostly women are targeted but men can be gullible as well! Just be wary of people who are over-friendly. Then there's cold-callers, the presence of grab handles at the door or a visible key safe are a give-away to elderly occupants. Should you be under pressure, perhaps being told that there is a loose slate on your roof, say that you will get your son to fix it, even if you don't have a son! Or if persuaded to part with some money, pay by cheque, then immediately cancel it by ringing the bank.

The idea behind wassailing is simply to wake up the apple trees by making lots of noise, and give their roots a drink of cider, and everyone who came along really pitched in to these activities. Rachel Thomas welcomed everyone with apple cake and provided a wonderful folky accompaniment to the procession as it wound noisily around the orchard. The setting was perfect- a big new moon complementing a wonderful sunset, fairy lights lighting up some of the trees and the church bells ringing out.

Around the brazier at the end, Jane Roberts and Mark read poems for the Wassail, and we concluded with Lily singing, beautifully, 'The Moon Shines Bright' -an old Mayday song. This was an unforgettable and poignant moment to round off a memorable evening.







In Maple and Willow Class (Years 1 to 3) we have been Design and Technology Engineers, designing and making

sewing.










We also had local milliners, Janet and David Williams, in to visit and provide us with some expertise and inspiration.

WEST TOWN FARM NEWS Local, Organic, Sustainable

WEST TOWN FARM

Save the date: Spring on the farm 6th May 2023

Family friendly open day at the farm - all welcome, keep an eye out on social media for more info and updates @westtownfarm and on Facebook.

So, what's so good about organic meat?

Independent research from Newcastle University 2022 shows that:

- Organic meat contains about 50% more beneficial omega-3 fatty acids than conventionally produced products. Western diets are deficient in these omega-3s and it is recommended that we double our intake.
- Organic meat has lower concentrations of potentially harmful saturated fatty acids (associated with blood cholesterol and insulin resistance).
- The research supports the view that the quality of meat is influenced by the way it is produced. Under organic standards, cows must eat at least 60% fresh grass, or conserved hay/silage. Livestock must also be reared outdoors for at least part of the year (at West Town our cattle are 100% grass fed)
- The research also supports the view that the nutritional quality of meat is influenced by the way it is produced. The outdoor grazing/foraging based diets of organic farming were responsible for the more desirable fats found in organic compared to non-organic meat.
