LOCAL ELECTIONS 4 MAY 2023

Laura Bell, Nick Bradley, Paula Burton Perrett, Nick Creasy, Ben Ervine, Rachel Herbert, Jessica Paine and Mark Thomas applied to Teignbridge District Council to continue to serve as Ide Parish Councillors for the next four years. This means the election was uncontested, and all eight have been duly re-elected. Voting for District Councillors will take place on 4 May 2023 as planned.

Andy Swain, who has served as a parish councillor for over 10 years and a district councillor for eight, is standing down. He has been an active and innovative councillor, in particular over responding to the climate crisis. His leaving creates a big gap on the parish council. We would like to thank him here for his involvement, and his careful, supportive and thoughtful contributions over the years. So we have a vacancy on the Parish Council; and you don't have to wait for the next elections in four years' time to fill it. You can apply at any time, and be elected by co-option as a full parish councillor. If you fancy joining the Council, or would like information about what's involved, do contact Nick Bradley (Chair) or Mel Liversage (Clerk) - details below.

TEIGNBRIDGE PROPOSED LOCAL PLAN

Following recommendations from a local planning expert we are in discussions with a planning consultant who is free from prior conflicts of interest. He is willing to advise the Parish Council in our representations to the Examination in Public of the next stage of the Teignbridge Local Plan 2020-2040. The Council submitted its considered comments in March, opposing the building of a 900 house new village at Markham's Farm. The public hearing to examine Teignbridge's Local Plan is timetabled for November this year. The Plan is now being revised in the light of comments received.

To make a good case at the public hearing, we will need expert advice to firm up and elevate our arguments in the context of planning law and national policy. But we don't have a line in this year's budget to cover it! We will soon make an appeal to the village to cover the £6,000 that the expert advice will cost. To reassure residents, we won't formally instruct the consultant until we have the funds to cover their fee.

IDE COMMUNITY ORCHARD – VOLUNTEERS' DAY 14 MAY 2023 at 10.00 am – The orchard trees need mulching. If you're free, come along with a wheelbarrow and shovel; or secateurs, thick gloves and a lopper if you'd prefer to do battle with a blackthorn thicket.

The Teignbridge Conservation Officer also highlighted these concerns. Ide planning committee had previously objected to the application. The new application should align with the previous report of the Conservation Officer and the updated designs for the fence and gate should keep in line with the character of the conservation area. 2 Fore Street holds a significant position at the gateway into Ide village. This attractive brick building from the Victorian period forms a valuable part of the Ide Conservation Area.

Also, please could we ask that you use the Post Office in the daytime rather than close to 4/5pm when all the business people come in – we hate to keep anyone waiting and some of the local businesses bring in quite a bit of post and it is a challenge sometimes to get it all done by 4.40pm when the postman arrives to start collecting it.

Can we thank all those who leave the Post Office Car Parking Space clear - we really do appreciate it. We need to be able to access the alarms at any point for a call out or working late to cash up, and so appreciate being able to pull onto the space.

Thank you for everyone's hard work, participation and just fun with all the Easter activities in the shop. Likewise, it was fun to watch everyone finding the escaped bunnies around the village over Easter. We provide free teas, coffees and cakes with a lot of friendly chatter. Everyone welcome.




