



Weir Meadow Playing Field Sports pitches

The meadow has been transformed! Ed Mortimer undertook the initial phase of ground preparation; and the phase 2 works – spring tining, power harrowing and drilling, rolling, liming and fertilizing – then smoothing the ground before sowing the seed bed, were undertaken by Sam Burdick of County Grounds Maintenance. Sports pitch grade grass seed was spread and rolled on 6 September. Already the meadow is green with new grass. Notices have been put in place to ask people to stick to the path round the edge, and keep dogs tight on the lead, so that the new seed can fully germinate and the grass become established. Special thanks go to Peter Skinner for co-ordinating the phases so enthusiastically and expertly.

Meadow Entrance

The ditch inside the entrance has been repaired. Soil was removed and rubble rolled in as infill, to provide a level and strong entrance area. The materials were supplied free of charge by BT Jenkins and the groundwork undertaken by Bob Lowton. The pile of soil remaining was levelled out starting with some back breaking spade and barrow work by volunteers, and finished with the arrival of James Romain and a tractor from Whiddon Farm. Thankyou to all involved.

Pedestrian Bridge

The restoration of the old pedestrian bridge is now complete, with the help of a donation of £2100 from the Ide Twinning Association - recently wound up. Bob Lowton and his team repaired the structural stone work underneath the bridge in July; and Will Bosworth installed the beautiful oak posts and rails over the bridge at the end of August. We are grateful to Will for giving his time for free, while we supplied the materials.

We also thank Ide Rugby Club for their generous donation of £952.20 following the club's recent winding up. We will plant a tree with a plaque in Oak Bank to mark this.

Community Orchard

IDE APPLE DAY is on Saturday 21 October 2023, 11am to 3pm. Please see the separate arrangements in this magazine and posters around the village. We will be harvesting apples, pressing and bottling juice from the orchard on this day. Everyone is welcome to join in: there will be other activities going on at the same time that are family friendly.

We are planning two talks over the autumn, themed around the Orchard: one from the RSPB about birdlife in Devon orchards, and another from Sandford Cider about cider orchards.

Thank you to everyone who has worked so hard on the Management Group over the last few months.

Allotments

The Parish Council provides eight allotment garden plots, located behind Ide School. We currently have one vacant plot, available to rent under annual licence, at a cost of £39.37 per annum. Flood avoidance With autumn now here and its fall of leaves and other debris, the Emergency Planning Working Group advise residents to keep gratings and roadside gutters clear outside their houses to avoid flash flooding. We have sandbags stored in the portacabin in the car park and in the Huntsman carpark.

Planning Matters Pynes Farm Yard

The Planning Committee heard details of Heritage Homes' plans for Pynes Farm Yard at its meeting in public on 20 September, ahead of the developer's submission of a new full planning application. Heritage Homes now own the site. The key element of the existing permission remains: ten houses, with two of them being affordable homes. A survey of the existing buildings shows the stone walls are cracked, the cob is crumbling, and they will have to be pulled down. The new scheme includes a small strip of scrub at the top of the site, allowing a better green space. The new design allows more space for each house, and ditching the retaining walls of the original scheme. The design will use handmade bricks, cedar cladding, and barn-like tall windows, with zero carbon insulation and heating systems. The committee was impressed with the improvements over the old scheme, and looks forward to seeing the details of the application once it is submitted.

Pynes Farm House

The Church Commissioners have decided to sell the Farm House unoccupied, rather than rent it out. It will appear on the market soon, we understand.

If we are not fully present for many of these moments, we may not only miss what is most valuable in our lives but also fail to realise the richness and the depth of our possibilities for growth and transformation. It is... a turning towards life.... To live life as if each moment is important, as if each moment counted and could be worked with, even if it is a moment of pain, sadness, despair, or fear. – Jon Kabat Zinn.

If you would like to find out more why not come along to an introductory evening on Tuesday 19th September? The course starts on Tuesday 3rd October and will run on Tuesday evenings until 21^{st of} November from 6.30-9.00 pm.

This course from the Mindfulness Association is free of charge and is being run by Kevin Dudman a mindfulness teacher who will introduce you to the building blocks of mindfulness techniques to enable you to bring a sense of mindfulness into your day-to-day life.

We were kept on tenterhooks leading up to the trip to Dartmouth, with at one time a full bus, as the weather started to not have got the message that the Jubilee Club had an outing planned empty seats were plentiful. The sun shone as we set off on The Kingswear Castle paddle ship, which following a refit had only returned to service in July this year. She uses 1/2 a ton of Welsh coal every day to power the engine which dates back to 1904 and the ship to 1924. We headed out to the mouth of the river, passing Dartmouth Castle the earliest parts dating back to the 1380s were built in response to a threat of a French attack. At this point we were 80 miles from the French Coast. Time to make a turn, it was a bit bumpy but soon in smooth waters as we sailed back passing Kingswear Castle which was completed in 1502 built to protect Dartmouth Harbour, one of the first purpose built artillery forts in Britain. Yet another Castle as we travelled along past Bayards Castle built between 1522 and 1536 containing heavy guns as the last line of defence against enemy ships that may have eluded Dartmouth and Kingswear Castles and the iron chain stretched across the estuary. We now passed many very expensive properties one on the market for a mere £7.600 million, any offers? As we progressed up the river the splendid Brittania RoyalNaval College came into view, where our late Queen met her future husband Prince Philip. We had a sighting of Braveheart a steam train travelling on the English Riviera line. The boat turned just below Greenway, Agatha Christie's old home to return to Dartmouth. Thank you to those able to give us support on this outing.



NEW FLAGPOLE FOR IDE CHURCH

For some time the old church tower flagpole was left in pieces on the roof as it had become too rotten to be safely used. This was the subject of Parochial Church Council discussion for some time. Peter Cloke, who was due to become a church warden just after his tragic accident, was keen to replace the flagpole on the tower roof rather than abandon it or locate it elsewhere. Following the accident, Nick Bradley and Ian Campbell thought it would be a fitting gesture to complete the flagpole replacement project. With



the full support of the PCC, a new aluminium pole and flag were purchased with Church funds and Nick and Ian set about erecting it which was not without its

challenges as the photos may suggest.





After morning service on 3rd September we had the first flag break which was performed by Sue Cloke with Rev Mike Partridge in attendance. The congregation looked on, or up, from the church yard. It is good to see a flag flying again from the Tower. Interestingly, there is little direction from Church authorities as to what flag should be flown and when so the traditional flag of St George seemed like the best option. The plan is for it to fly most of the time except when strong windforecast (and someone remembers to take it down) as these considerably shorten the life of the flag. It may not always return quickly as someone has to climb the narrow tower spiral steps to raise or lower the flag. We hope that the village community will enjoy the return of a flag flying from the tower.


