

IDE COMMUNITY ORCHARD

At 4.30am on Friday 21 June, a group of insomniacs and romantics met at the top of the orchard to watch the sun rise and mark the summer solstice. We are soon to install a kissing gate beside the main five bar gate at the entrance to the orchard, to prevent exuberant children or dogs running out onto the road on their way home. And a series of information and interpretation boards are being designed for display around the Orchard by the autumn.

WEIR MEADOW PLAYING FIELD AND THE NORTHERN FIELDS

The specialist grass planted in Weir Meadow has now been mown several times. It's coarser than we had hoped, with some bald patches because the wet spring and early summer did not allow the contractors to remove the first cuttings. But it's now growing fast. Four picnic tables and a bench have been assembled and installed, with six more tables to follow. The artificial cricket wicket is to be laid in August; and the cricket and football pitch areas will be marked out in July. Plans are well in hand for the first annual Ide Revel, to be held on Saturday 7 September 2024. There will be sports activities, live music, games, food stalls and bar and much, much more — so look out for further details. We submitted an application in mid April for a Woodland Creation Planning Grant for the Northern Fields and are still awaiting a response. We have also submitted an application to the Sport England Movement Fund to pay for a wide area rotary mower, and again await their response.

Apologies that we had to change the date of the AGM. The new date is Friday 20th September in the Village Hall at 8pm. Do come along and hear about the last year in shop world if you can.

Are you new to the village? Have you visited the shop yet? If you haven't, we would love to see you and give you a warm welcome and show you the shop and the wide range of local and other products that we stock. Please don't fall for the line that community shops are more expensive: on a lot of lines like Burt's Crisps we are the cheapest in the area, including Sainsbury's by quite an amount. We regularly check our prices against the supermarkets and lately a lot of lines - including branded lines are actually cheaper here - and that is before you take into account the fuel and time savings. Also, by supporting the shop you support other community activities in the village that the shop support as well as a great number of local growers and producers. Also, the shop is the hub



of the village and a great place to meet people and hear all what is happening in the village. You are a person in the shop – not a beep through the till like impersonal supermarkets.

There are lots of ways to get involved in the shop both up front and behind the scenes and we welcome all sorts of people to join our happy team – and there is a niche and role for everyone – with as much or as little commitment as you like. We are very blessed and fortunate to have some great people who have worked hard for the shop for a very long time – but at some point they will need to retire and have a well-deserved rest, so we welcome interest from anyone who might want to help in specific role in the shop, or have a set skill base to do a role that needs to be done each week. These roles are vital to shop life but are not widely known. So again, do tell us if you have a skill or trade that could be useful to keep the mechanism of shop life turning long into the future.

A reminder that the postman has to leave us at 5pm and is on a tight schedule so cannot hang around for late post. So please do come down as early as you can so we can get your post away. Don't forget with our new extended opening you can

avoid the afterschool rush as well now by coming down earlier. We get good commission from the Post Office on banking transactions at no cost to our customers. So please do consider using us if you can as every extra banking transaction really does help the shop.

We still have over 350 of our handmade cloth bags out and about in the village somewhere. People kindly donated the fabric to make these bags and Janet organised a fabulous team to make them so they could be of use to our customers and we could eliminate plastic bags from the shop but sadly people are not returning them. Please can you check your cars, sheds and cupboards etc to see if you have one (or more) of our cloth bags and bring it back to the shop - ideally to fill up and reuse as that is what they were meant for. Thank you for your help on this.

Eve Jennings 1925-2024


I know many will have written about their memories of Eve but I would like to add to those memories as among her many other talents, she was also a valued member of Ide Art Group right from the very early days.





Today we were very pleased to host a site visit by members of Devon Rewilding Network and others, explaining the history of the site at Hill Crest and showing them the ongoing nature restoration work we started back in 2012, including the woodland planted with Moor Trees in 2017/18. Some of us from Ide took the 'long' drive out to Longdown (well it would have been shorter if we hadn't missed Kate's strategically placed sign) to find out how Kate and Richard's rewilding project is progressing. It was a totally fascinating day and we all learned a lot about the potential of rewilding to heal the natural world.

Last year's State of Nature report lays bare the stark fact that nature is still seriously declining across the UK, a country that is already one of the most nature depleted in the world. Since 1970 UK species have declined by nearly 20% on average, and almost 1 in 6 species are now threatened with extinction. It was genuinely inspiring to find out how one couple's dedication to reversing this decline and the dedication of all the others involved in larger and smaller projects across the country is making a difference. The importance of connectedness was also made clear, working with neighbouring land and garden owners to create the wildlife corridors essential for sustainable wildlife populations. If you missed the event but would like to know more about the project's successes, you can find out more on Rewilding Hill Crest's facebook page. Like many of you, I worry about the world we are leaving our children and grandchildren and the impact on mental wellbeing that is already affecting them. We need the good news and hope which projects like this can provide. The cream tea with wonderful scones and brownies also did a lot for morale! Many many thanks to everyone involved. (Editor)

It's mid June and we have a lovely bit of sunshine for a few days. kjprovide food for the cattle and sheep in the winter. We need 5 days of sunshine and no rain. It's a risk because the weather forecast seems to change at the drop of a hat these days. If it rains on the



grass after 2 days, the grass deteriorates in feed value considerably; basically the nutrients of the grass/ hay get washed into the soil. So fingers crossed for the farmers.

June is my favourite month of the year; full of hope, new life, growth and bounty. The flowers at the farm are all out in bloom. The honeysuckle and the roses in the

farmyard are looking gorgeous.

The first young swallows are fledgeling and finding their first wings. The swallows love our old farm buildings to make their nests. Especially the farm shop, which is always a bit of a surprise when walking in.

Kate and Simon have finished lambing the sheep now and the calving the calves finished in May. Now all she has to do is to keep them fit and healthy. Looking after 70 lambs and their mums and 10 calves and their mums as a stockperson this is a fulltime job.

The bell tents are up in Easterbrooks, they look amazing. These will be available soon to hire. Keep an eye on our facebook.



The farm shop is full of sausages (you must try the sage and red onion...amazing!), mince, steaks and our homemade burgers. We also stock a variety of chocolate, soft drinks, local honey, eggs and milk. Pop in for a gander and also stop to take in all the birds in the yard.
