Ide Community Orchard - Harvest time is here, and we have a good crop of apples. Volunteers are needed to gather up and pick apples on Sunday morning 13th October in readiness for the Ide Apple Day which will take place on 19 October 2024, 10am to 2pm, on The Green. **See separate notice for details and timings**

Northern Fields – Community Woodland Creation scheme Stage 2. Julia Matthews, our consultant woodland designer, has produced an outline concept design of the scheme. We would like your views on the proposal, and we will hold a public event for interested parties on Thursday 10 October 2024 in the Memorial Hall, from 5pm to 7pm. The plans will be on display, and we will conduct two discussion sessions – one at 5pm and one at 6pm - for you to make comments and ask questions.

Weir Meadow Playing Field - Ide Revel 7 Sep 2024. Amidst torrential, merciless, all day and all night rain, the celebration and formal opening of Ide's new recreation ground went ahead with spirit and great joy. It was very well attended despite the weather, and still managed to turn a small profit. Huge thanks go to the Ide Revel team - Ied by Peter Skinner, Rachel Herbert and Cheryl Haddy, with expert event management from Laura and David Farrow - who worked so hard to make it such a wonderful and memorable occasion.

On 19 September the much anticipated artificial cricket wicket was laid in Weir Meadow. Paid for by Ide Cricket Club, the special surface is safer, more reliable, and needs much less maintenance and preparation than a traditional grass wicket. It is weather resistant, gives consistent bounce, and is fairer for all levels of cricket. Most usefully, it can be played on repeatedly - on consecutive days or on the same day - and used for training practice with a mobile cricket net.

Teignbridge Local Plan 2020-2040

The matter of the allocation of 900 new houses on the proposed Markham Village in the eastern half of the parish will be heard by the Examiners of the proposed Local Plan between 5 and 7 November, in public, at Forde House, Newton Abbot. Ide Parish Council will be taking part in the discussions, putting our case against the allocation, and proposing amendments to the plan should the Examiners determine to approve it. Our most recent statement to the examiners can be found on the TDC website.

Floods in Storm Ciarán, 2/3 November 2023

Devon County Council have published a report on the effects and extent of the floods last November. Ide was the worst affected village in Devon that night, with six individual properties sustaining significant damage. An action plan forms part of the report, and puts the county council and the Environment Agency at the centre of making arrangements to prevent flooding in the future. The report can be found on the Ide Village website.

Appeal against the refusal of planning application 22/00826/FUL- Formation of yard for storage of machinery and construction materials and the siting of 14 secure storage containers and associated landscaping (retrospective) PLANNING INSPECTORATE REF: 3331634. APPEAL DISMISSED

The TDC Enforcement Officer has reported that the Round Field site enforcement notice is due to be served shortly. A new application has now been received – see below.

PLANNING MATTERS New Applications

24/01428/FUL IDE - Land At Ngr 290858 90284, Ide Village Road Retention of yard for the storage of machinery and construction materials, the siting of 12 secure storage containers and associated landscaping.

This is a revised version of the retrospective application 22/00826/FUL, that was dismissed at appeal. It reduces the number of containers from 14 to 12, and adds tree and shrub planting along the margin with the A30.

Applications awaiting a decision from TDC

23/00463/FUL - Stevens Farm, Ide, EX2 9FB

Change of use of agricultural building and land to commercial use for the sales and maintenance of tractors. Objected to by IPC Planning Committee.

24/00432/MAJ - Pynes Farm, High Street, Ide Demolition of existing buildings and the erection of ten dwellings, associated access, parking, and landscaping. Revised plans have been submitted to TDC with the proposal now for a housing mix closer to that set out in the Neighbourhood Plan – now for 4 x two bed, 4 x three bed and 2 x four bed homes.

Decided Applications

24/00843/CAN - Canons, The Green, Ide.

Proposal to remove Holly Tree (areas 1-6) and Elder Tree (area 7). Agreed to defer to the TDC Tree Officer. **APPROVED BY TDC**
