#### IDE COMMUNITY ORCHARD is thriving.

There are still lots of unpicked and windfall apples to be enjoyed by residents and winter feeding birds. We hope that our pasteurised apple juice will soon be on sale in the Community Shop.

The Orchard Christmas lights switch on will happen on Saturday 14 December at 7pm with gathering from 6.30pm, with mulled apple juice and music.

The traditional Wassail celebration, blessing the trees to ensure a good harvest, is set for Sunday 2 February 2025 at 5pm.

Volunteer working parties, to mulch young trees, clear brambles and help with winter pruning, will be held on Sunday 12 January at 1.30 pm and on Sunday 9 February.

We are commissioning work to lay the hedge along the Orchard's western boundary in December. We have also agreed to level off the main diagonal path leading up to the top corner of the orchard.

#### WEIR MEADOW AND NORTHERN FIELDS.

**Football.** New, full size match goals on wheels will arrive soon, partly funded by a grant from the Football Foundation. We look forward to Ide Green Rovers playing their first match in the New Year. The Council has approved a Service Level Agreement between the Council and Ide Green Rovers FC for the club's use of the Weir Meadow football pitch. It sets out arrangements for pitch maintenance, ownership and provision of equipment, bookings and fees, and the club's commitment to using the ground.

We have also agreed to buy an additional pair of 8 x 6ft trainer goals for Weir Meadow, so that we can restore the goals on The Green back to a full pair.

Community Woodland and Trees. Following the public consultation event in the village hall on 10 October, we submitted a Stage 2 woodland creation grant application to the Forestry Commission through IPC's consultant, Julia Matthews, on 1 November 2024. It consists of the design for a community woodland including layout, fencing, tree protection, species, open spaces and paths. If approved, the hard works - paths and fencing - could start in summer 2025; and tree planting in the winter 2025/2026. Last month's Ide Times carried reproductions of the proposed woodland scheme: if you found the print a tad small to read, you can view the presentation panels on the village website idevillage.org.uk under Working Groups and Committees -> Weir Meadow and Northern Fields Working Group -> Community Woodland Scheme -> Woodland Design presentation Panels.

On 22 November volunteers planted 17 specimen trees - hornbeam and liquidambar – in the north west section of Weir Meadow to delineate the edge of the sports field from the wilder section of that corner of the meadow.

**Dogs**. Weir Meadow is taking full shape now as a playing field. Please remember that your dog must be kept on the lead whilst you are in the Meadow; and dogs may run free once you are in the Northern Fields.

**FLOOD PREVENTION**. Ide Parish Council discussed a report that it commissioned, and funded, from Nigel Smith of Teign Consult. It assesses the capacity of the catchment of Ide and Markham; and the engineering measures that might help prevent future flooding. The report is on the village website: Working Groups and Committees-> Flood Prevention Subgroup. We have sent it to the Land Management Team at the Environment Agency; South West Water; and to Devon County Council Flood Risk Management Team, who have asked their project engineer to assess the feasibility of the options, on a cost-benefit basis. Laying an additional 600mm pipe under Fore Street is one option that may warrant further investigation. Discussions are also ongoing with the landowners and their agents about planting lower risk crops and other possible natural preventive measures.

**BALLS FARM ROAD**. New larger "Access Only" signs have appeared on Dunsford Hill, to emphasise that Little Johns Cross Hill and Balls Farm Road are only for use by vehicles accessing properties along those roads; and to discourage vehicles from using those roads as rat runs.

**WESTOWN ROAD.** Beyond the Earles Court junction, Westown Road is also designated Access Only. It's tempting to get out of Ide onto the Longdown straight by using Westown Road, past Westown Farm, and up Haynes Lane: but it's not permitted.

24/01586/LBC - 5 The College, Ide: Installation of replacement doors. Supported by Ide Parish Council.

23/00463/FUL - Stevens Farm, Ide Village Road, Ide

Change of use of agricultural building and land to commercial use for the sales and maintenance of tractors. Objected to by Ide Parish Council. No further updates.

24/00432/MAJ - Pynes Farm, High Street, Ide Demolition of existing buildings and the erection of ten dwellings, associated access, parking, and landscaping. No further updates.

#### Applications decided by TDC

24/01428/FUL IDE - Land At Ngr 290858 90284, Ide Village Road: Retention of yard for the storage of machinery and construction materials, the siting of 12 secure storage containers and associated landscaping. Resubmission of application 22/00826/FUL. Application refused by TDC.

**Teignbridge Local Plan 2020-2040**. The three month Examination in public of the Plan, in Newton Abbot, has now ended. A team of four of us, representing Ide Parish Council, attended the hearing on 5 November to put further questions to TDC; and make our case to the Examiner against the allocation of a new 900 house Markham Village. We were encouraged that Exeter City Council had also decided to object to the Markham Village proposal, on the same grounds as us: damage to valuable landscape character, inadequate highways capacity, and unviable plans for cycling, walking and public transport. We anticipate the Examiners' report and decision in early February 2025.

**Mike Watson**. We were saddened to learn of the death on 17 November of Mike Watson. Mike, and Rosemary who predeceased him, used to live in Old Vicarage Close, before moving to Alphington some years ago. Mike served as a parish councillor through the 1980s and 1990s, bringing his banking skills to the role of treasurer, and his sense of humour to every meeting. Those who knew him in Ide will remember him with the greatest affection. We send our thoughts and best wishes to his daughters Nikki, Donna and Andrea.

The next meeting of Ide Parish Council is on Wednesday 15 January 2025 at 7.30pm in Ide Memorial Hall.

#### Markham Village



Nick Bradley, as chair of Ide Parish Council, ably supported by Dave Black and Patrick Irvine attended Teignbridge District Council's offices in Newton Abbot on 5<sup>th</sup> November for session 1 of week 4 of the public inquiry into the draft Teignbridge Local Plan 2020- 2040. This was the morning given over to Policy EE1- Markham Village- for the planning inspector to consider whether the proposed allocation by TDC for development of the site by 900 houses is justified, effective, positively prepared and consistent with national policies.

The inspector wished to hear on a wide variety of issues but those pertinent to the interests of Ide Parish Council were landscape, road safety, transportation and funding of required infrastructure.

Representations critical of the allocation were made on behalf of Exeter City Council, Heritage Homes, Exeter Civic Society, Alphington Village Forum and Ide Parish Council. The 3 land owners were represented in force by their promoter's professional team. Devon County Council is one of the 3 land owners and was also represented in its capacity as highway authority and education authority.

The inspector gave all parties a fair hearing in a discussion which was at times fractious- but never so on the part of our cool headed chair.

Nick had a number of carefully crafted and incisive questions for the inspector and TDC to consider which he ably worked into the discussion on each of the relevant points. These clearly gave the inspector pause for thought. Dave Black's invaluable experience of public inquiries and his background in highways and planning was key to framing those questions for maximum impact- which Nick clearly articulated in his measured but authoritative way. These were the result of many hours of reading and deliberation by Nick, Dave and Patrick who will be far too modest to admit the debt of gratitude that we owe to them in representing the interests of the village.

The inquiry was set to continue until 21<sup>st</sup> November and the inspector's report is unlikely to be issued until well into next year.



#### JUBILEE CLUB

Well, what a fascinating subject bee keeping proves to be. Mike Long came to talk about Bees and Honey, it's a family tradition, his grandfather having been a beekeeper. The flavour of honey is at it's very best when fresh, it granulates but by gently warming through will clear. At this time of the year the bees will find some nectar on late flowering plants and ivy is a good source. The Queen has now stopped laying and the male bees are kicked out of the hive, the bees must get on with the Queen if not a discontented hive can become aggressive. Honey is not the only product the hive produces there's wax and mead made by the monks from the left over from extracting the honey. Local honey from local pollen is reputed to be good for hay fever.

Pollen grains come in different colours, pink and yellow and is extracted from the bees legs. World-wide there are 250 different species of bees, there can be up to 50,000 in a hive but only 50 bumble bees in a nest, death rates in honey bees are high due to a heavy workload. Drones are there to eat the honey and fertilise the

workers. At Christmas they are given fondant icing a special feed for the winter. Honeybees do a waggle dance telling other bees where to go for nectar, bumble bees don't do this, they have longer tongues enabling them to feed on different flowers. The vroa mite sucks the juices from grubs resulting in deformed bees Then there's the Asian hornet,a predator from the Continent which kills bees.



11th saw us off on a trip to Monkton Elm, a chance to enjoy lunch out and maybe even do some Christmas shopping or just a good excuse for a day out with good company. As ever we are grateful for the support on these visits without which it would not be a viable possibility.




# WEST TOWN FARM NEWS Local, Organic, Sustainable
